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
The Elements of Art and the Color Families

- 15. An element of art that refers to the way things feel, or look as if they might feel if touched.

- 3. any one of a group of related colors that are near each other on the color wheel.

- 7. The phrase used to describe any color that is vivid or bold in nature.
- 10. An element of art that is three-dimensional and encloses volume; includes height, width AND depth.
- 12. An element of art by which positive and negative areas are defined or a sense of depth achieved in a work of art.
