

- **3.** amendment that states the presidential line of succession
- 5. He was the third vice president of the United States; served as a Continental Army officer in the American Revolutionary War
- 8. made a major contribution to the ratification of the Constitution by writing The Federalist Papers, along with Alexander Hamilton and John Jay; and was referred to as the "Father of the Constitution."
- **10.** he or she serves as the President of the Senate; first in line of presidential succession
- **12.** responsible for electing the President based on the popular vote

- **13.** the youngest man elected to the office; was assassinated in Dallas, Texas, becoming also the youngest President to die.
- **14.** major author of the Federalist papers, and first secretary of the treasury of the United States (1789–95), who was the foremost champion of a strong central government for the new United States. He was killed in a duel with Aaron Burr.
