
The Great Depression

2. a program designed to provide a decent standard of living to all Americans by spreading the nation's wealth among the people.

3. government spending, in excess of revenue, of funds raised by borrowing rather than from taxation.

5. legislative initiative proposed to add more justices to the U.S. Supreme Court.
9. The first hundred days of Roosevelt's presidency where he passed a bunch of laws and really mobilized action to solve the Great Depression

10. a long-term economic state characterized by unemployment and low prices and low levels of trade and investment bank run / sudden withdrawal of deposits of just one bank. 12. a group of experts appointed to advise a government or politician.
13. the people who migrated from Oklahoma (also the people in general) in search of work-- often did not find any because of the Great Depression.
