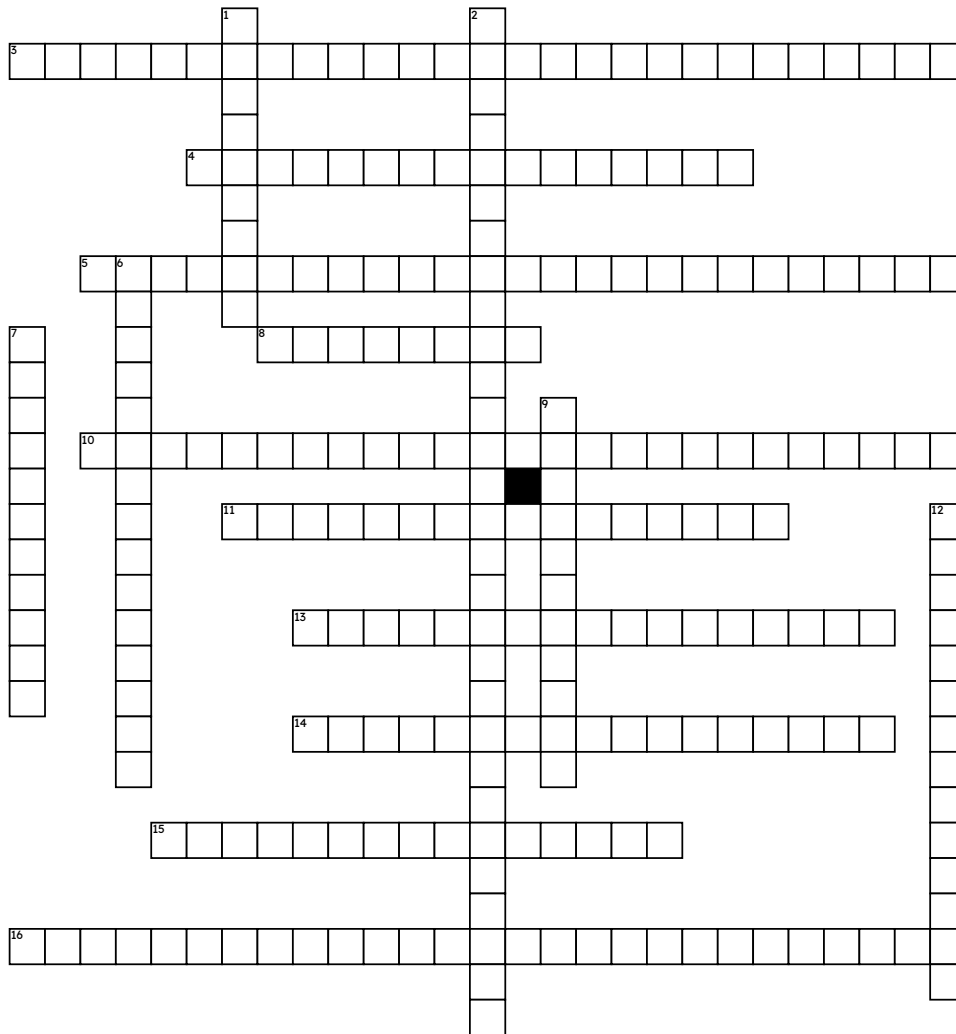


# The New Deal



**Across**

- 3. agency created during the Great Depression to provide young Americans with aid and employment
- 4. created by FDR; alignment of diverse groups dedicated to supporting the Democratic Party
- 5. passed in 1933 to raise crop prices by paying farmers to leave a certain amount of their land unplanted, thus lowering production
- 8. Senator of Louisiana
- 10. program that put young men aged 18 to 25 to work building roads, developing parks, planting trees, and helping soil-erosion and flood-control project

- 11. social reformer; combined humanitarian impulses with great political skills
- 13. passed in 1935 to aid to retired people, unemployed people, disabled people, and families with dependent children
- 14. African American; dedicated to promoting opportunities to young African Americans
- 15. spending more money than the government receives in revenue

- 1. also called the "National Labor Relations Act"; created in 1935 to protect the rights of workers

- 2. provided money to state to create jobs in the construction of schools and other community games
- 6. movie created in 1939 about the life of Southern plantation owners during the Civil War; one of the most popular films of all time
- 7. appointed as commissioner of Indian affairs by FDR in 1933; helped create the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934
- 9. actor, director, producer, and writer who created a radio broadcast called 'The War of the Worlds'
- 12. America's first female cabinet worker; secretary of labor
