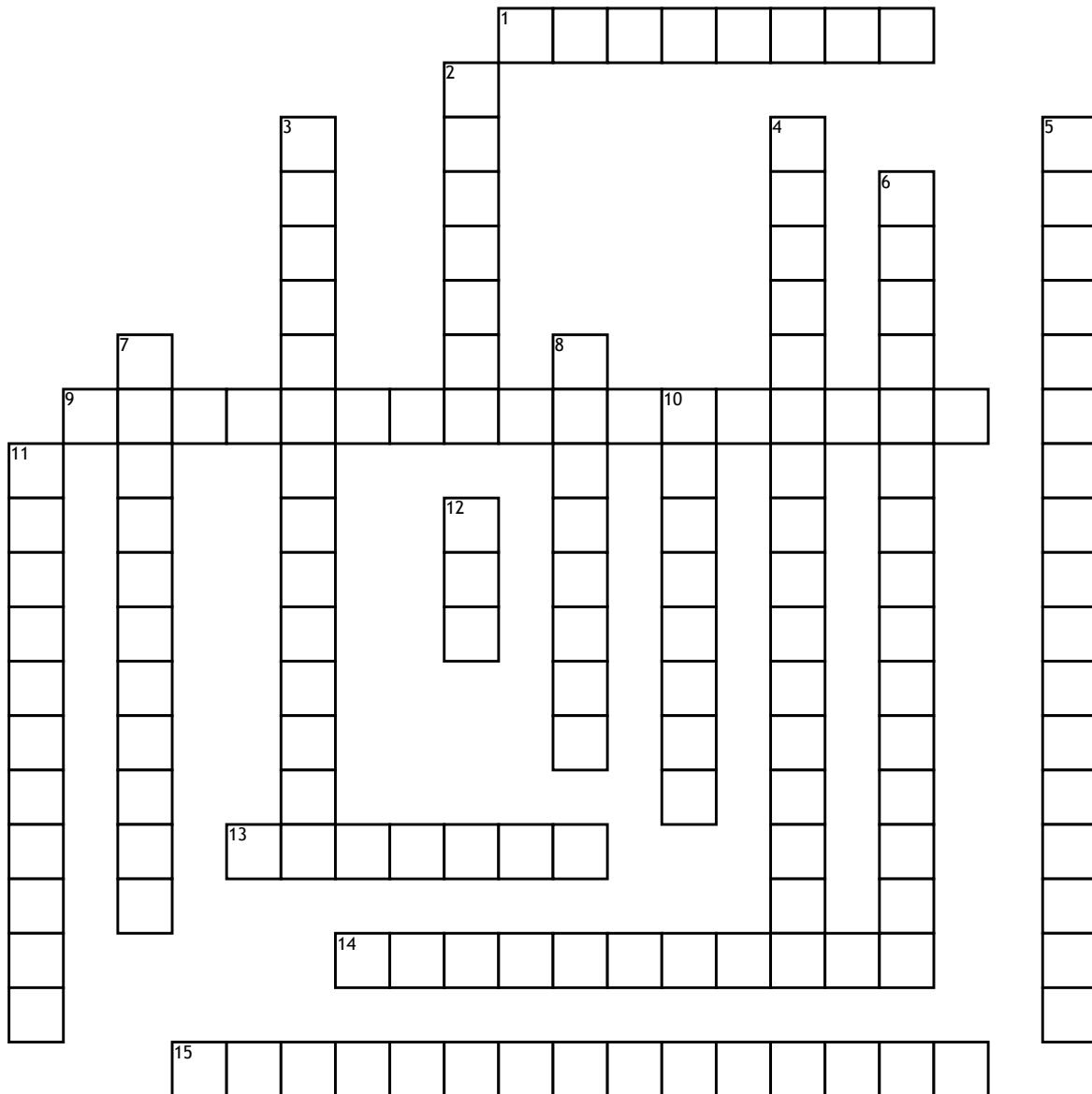

- 2. was a period in the 1920s, ending with the Great Depression, in which jazz music and dance styles became popular, mainly in the United States

- 3. the generation reaching maturity during and just after World War I, a high proportion of whose men were killed during those years
- 4. were Italian-born American anarchists who were convicted of murdering a guard and a paymaster during the armed robbery of the Slater and Morrill Shoe Company
- 5. A law that severely restricted immigration by establishing a system of national quotas that blatantly discriminated against immigrants from southern and eastern Europe and virtually excluded Asians. The policy stayed in effect until the 1960s.

- 6. The movement seeking to protect and inform consumers by requiring such practices as honest packaging and advertising, product guarantees, and improved safety standards
- 7. were a series of raids conducted by the United States Department of Justice to capture, arrest and deport radical leftists, especially anarchists, from the United States.
