
## The Spanish-American War

- 1. served as the 26th president of the United States from 1901 to 1909, his military service as a "Rough Rider" during the Spanish-American War

- **4.** raised protective tariffs to promote American industry, and maintained the nation on the gold standard in a rejection of inflationary proposals
