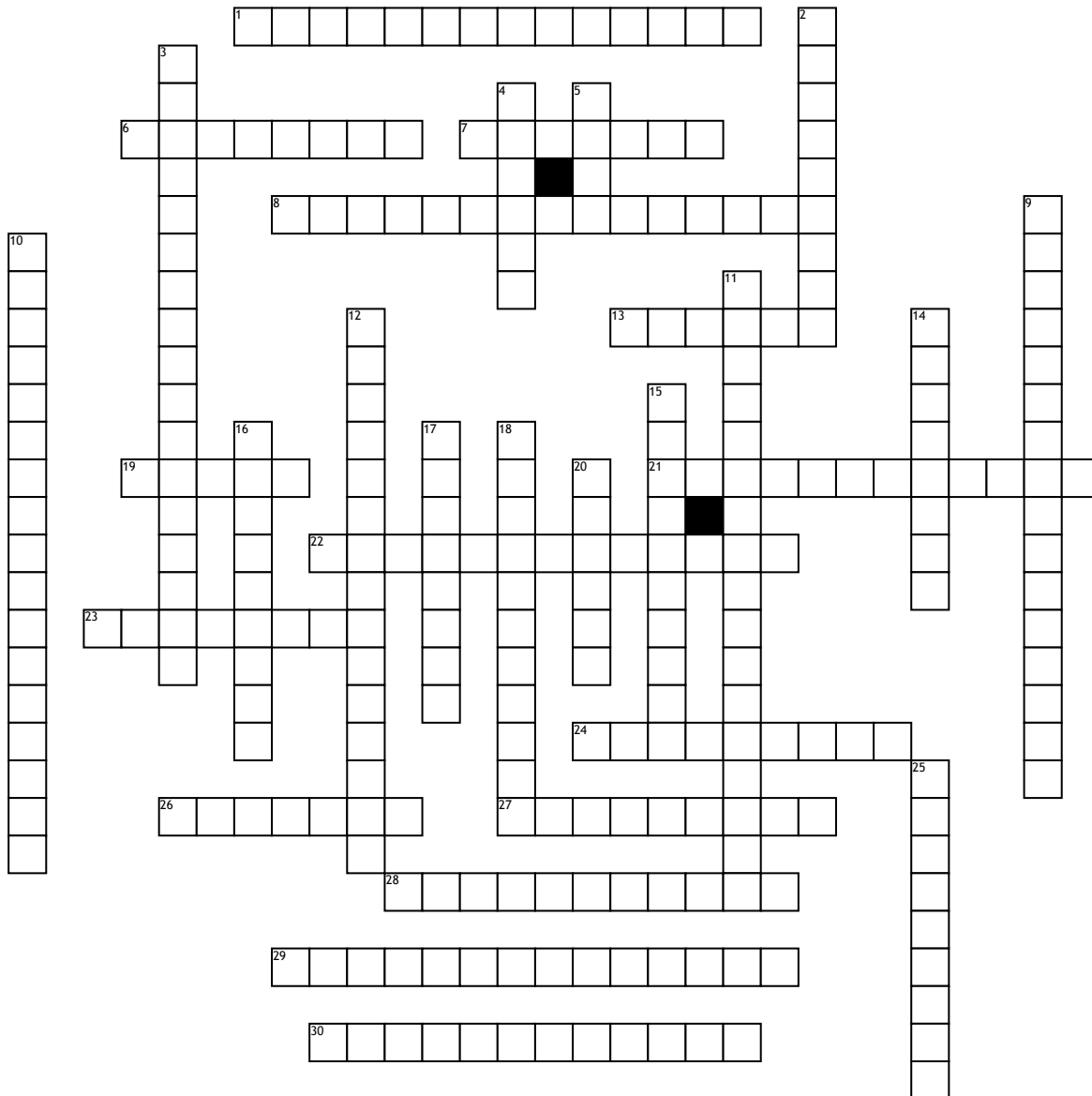


# The US Constitution/Government
