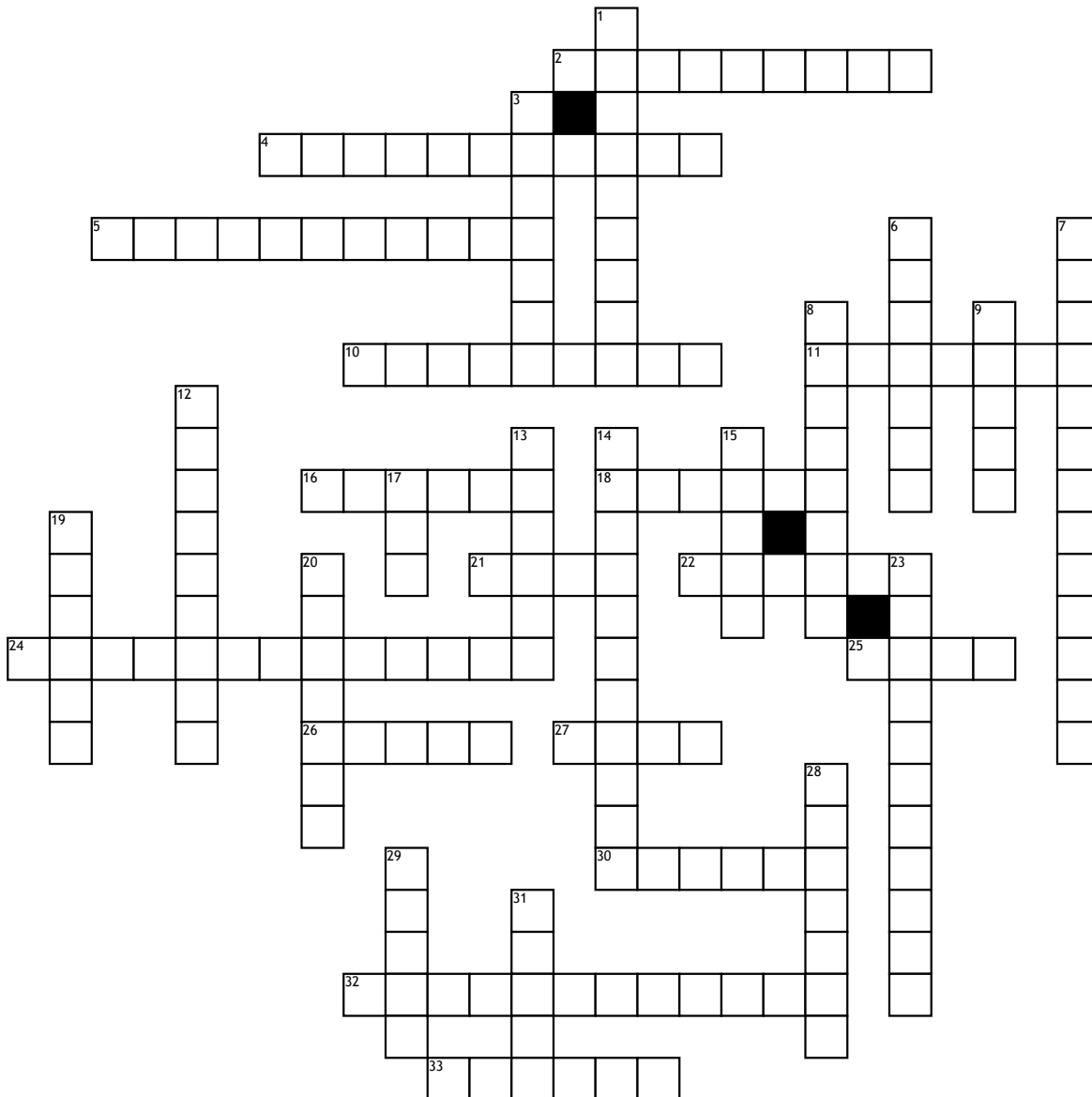


The Water Crossword
