

- 2. Hemolytic anemia
- **3.** Inflammation of the kidney
- **5.** One or both kidneys are enlarged and have many blisterlike sacs containing urine
- **11.** Excessive intake of sugary foods
- **14.** When urine becomes extremely concentrated
- **16.** When the bladder is unable to expel urine

- **17.** Bleeding in the urinary tract
- **18.** Painful urination
- **19.** When ADH is not released, huge amounts of very dilute urine to flush from the body day after day
- **20.** Inflammation of the bladder

- Large volumes of urine are excreted
- 4. Urinary tract infection
- 6. Liver disease

- 7. Hypoaldosteronism
- **8.** Physical exertion, or pregnancy
- 9. Abnormally low urinary output that is less than 100 ml/dy
- 10. Abnormally low urinary output between 100 & 400 ml/dy
- **12.** Enlargement of the prostate gland
- **13.** Unable to voluntarily control the external sphincter
- **15.** Inflammation of the urethra
