

- 1. the stage area to the actor's left as he or she faces the audience
- **4.** A printed copy of the play
- **6.** to increase voice or actions so they will carry to the audience
- **9.** The area of the stage closest to the audience
- **12.** The act of vocal expression, utterance or enunciation uttered clearly in distinct syllables
- **14.** Information that is implied in the dialogue but not stated
- **15.** The area of the stage extending beyond the proscenium

- **16.** telling a story or presenting an idea through bodily movement and expression rather than word
- **17.** the stage area in the center of the stage
- **18.** a stage with a permanent framed opening through which the audience sees the play
- **19.** An actor's move from one side of the stage to another
- **20.** The smallest unit of dramatic action

- **3.** Stage direction referring to the back of the stage, or that part furthest from the audience
