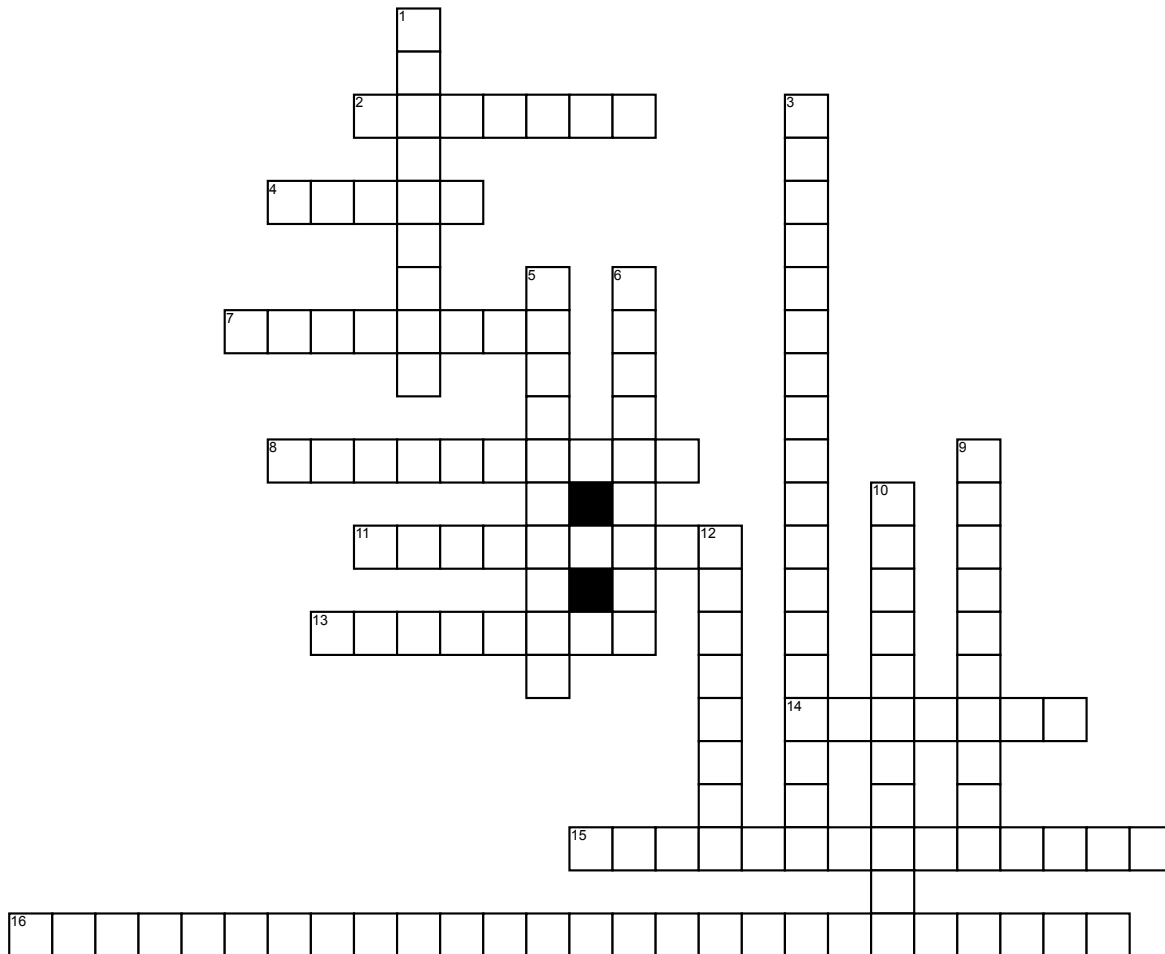


# To Kill a Mockingbird Crossword
