# Types of Dancing

1. an artistic dance form performed to music using precise and highly formalized set steps and gestures **H** A. Foxtrot
2. a dance performed wearing shoes fitted with metal taps, characterized by rhythmical tapping of the toes and heels **I** B. Waltz
3. a popular dance, considered as part of the tradition or custom of a particular people **E** C. Jitterbug
4. a folk dance in which couples face each other in two lines or a square **D** D. Contra Dance
5. dancing in which solo dancers perform acrobatics that involve touching various parts of the body (such as the back or head) to the ground **F** E. Folk Dancing
6. a vigorous rhythmic dance style of the Andalusian Gypsies **G** F. Break-dancing
7. a ballroom dance in 4/4 time, with alternation of two slow and two quick steps. **A** G. Flamenco
8. a dance in triple time performed by a couple who as a pair turn rhythmically around and around as they progress around the dance floor **B** H. Ballet
9. a ballroom dance originating in Buenos Aires, characterized by marked rhythms and postures and abrupt pauses **J** I. Tap Dancing
10. a fast dance popular in the 1940s, performed chiefly to swing music. **C** J. Tango
