
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Types of drugs

- 1. delusions, illusions, hallucinations, paranoia, extreme anxiety, nausea
- **5.** confusion, sedation, unconsciousness, coma, and addiction
- **10.** what drug causes nausea, abdominal pain, malnutrition, headache, stroke, seizure, heart attack, death, and exposure to HIV through contaminated needles, addiction
