A. Defense Attorney

2. A system of law concerned with punishment through detention.

B. Prosecute

3. A plea of a criminal defendant who does not intend to contest the charges or a verdict by jury that believes the defendant committed the crime. C. Civil

4. A place for lawful confinement of people waiting for their trial or for those convicted of misdemeanor offenses.

D. Expert Witness

5. A sworn body of people gathered to decide an impartial verdict of guilt or innocence.

E. Court Clerk

6. A place of confinement for people convicted of serious crimes, usually administered by the State or Federal government.

F. Court Reporter

7. To hold a trial against a person who is accused of a crime to see if that person is guilty.

G. Appeal

8. Application to a higher court to dispute a lower court's decision.

H. Guilty

9. Provides instructions to the jury prior to their deliberations, makes rulings, responsible for sentencing convicted criminal defendants.

I. Witness/Eyewitness

10. Attorney that represents the state; Presents evidence to court that proves defendant is guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

J. Prison

11. Secures the courtroom; Transports prisoners to and from the courtroom.

K. Judge

12. Utilized sternography to keep record what is being said in the courtroom.

L. Bailiff

13. Listens to information being presented in the courtroom while being unbiased and impartial; Deliberates and reads their verdict.

M. Criminal

14. Attorney that represents the defendant; Presents evidence to court that proves the defendant's innocence.

N. Character Witness

15. Those who see or hear the crime take place.
