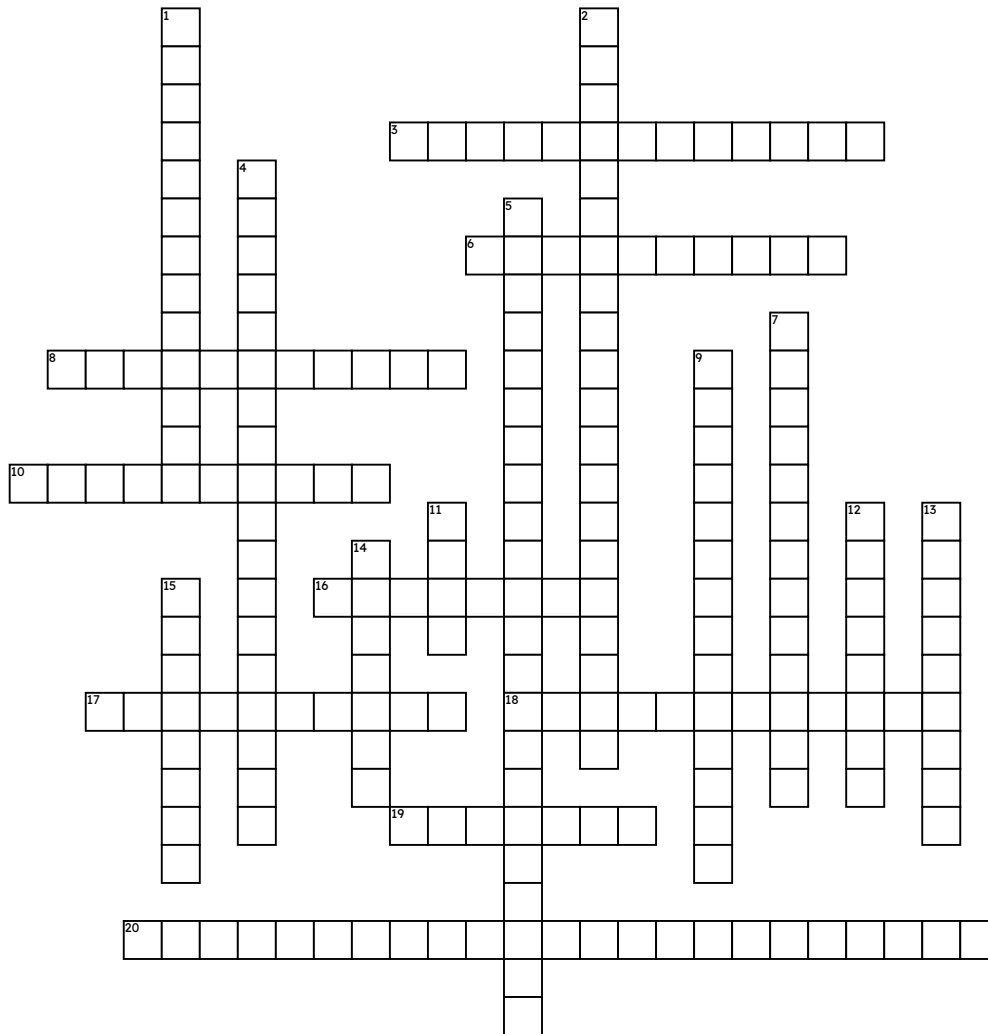


Unit 5 Crossword Puzzle Appetizer
