

- 1. Christ's Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension
- 2. The Sacrament in which we receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. It is not merely a symbol.
- 3. The word used to describe the change of bread and wine at Mass into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ
- **4.** The first part of the Mass in which we receive the written Word of God.
- **6.** A title for Jesus, which recalls the sacrifice made by the Israelites on the night of Passover.
- 7. Also known as "bread from heaven," it was given by God to the Israelites to keep them from starving in the desert.

- **8.** Hebrew for "assembly" or "congregation."
- **10.** Hebrew for "thanksgiving." Ancient Jewish liturgy at the Temple which consisted of a sacred meal of bread and wine.
- 12. Final meal Jesus shared with His apostles before His Passion. This was also the First Mass.
- **14.** Liturgical celebration and memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross and Resurrection from the dead.
