1. Christ's Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension 2. The Sacrament in which we receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ under the
appearances of bread and wine. It is not merely a symbol.
2. The word used to describe the change of bread and wine at Mass into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ
3. The first part of the Mass in which we receive the written Word of God.
4. A title for Jesus, which recalls the sacrifice made by the Israelites on the night of Passover.
5. Also known as "bread from heaven," it was given by God to the Israelites to keep them from starving in the desert.
6. Hebrew for "assembly" or "congregation."
7. Hebrew for "thanksgiving." Ancient Jewish liturgy at the Temple which consisted of a sacred meal of bread and wine.
8. Final meal Jesus shared with His apostles before His Passion. This was also the First Mass.
9. Liturgical celebration and memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the Cross and Resurrection from the dead.
10. A philosophical term that refers to what a thing is made of
