 The two periods of time, in the 1920s and 1950s, in which Americans feared the growth of communism. These suspicions led to tests of the civil liberties of people under the Constitution
 Also known as the "Monkey Trial", this 1920s case pitted the forces of religious fundamentalism (and the literal meaning of the Bible) against the new age of thinking and materialism (studying biology through the theory of evolution established by Darwin)
 Black writer of the Harlem Renaissance (1920's) who used jazz and blues themes and rhythms in his poetry. His work speaks to Black pride and the injustice/hurt of discrimination 6. Nickname for the decade of 1920s and 1950s, in which Americans feared the growth of communism. These suspicions led to tests of civil liberties of people under the Constitution
7. United States policy which favored the interests of native born inhabitants over those of immigrants
