

- 1. One of the three R's of Roosevelt's goals. This was returning the economy back to normal
- 5. This is the general name to the collection of all the administrative acts which made up Roosevelt's policy for addressing the Great Depression
- 9. The name of the crisis at hand that spanned much of the 1930s
- 13. Part of FERA and provided temporary jobs during cruel winter emergency
- 14. Granted about \$3 billion to states for direct dole payments or wages on work projects
- 15. Insured individual deposits up to \$5000.
- 16. One of the three R's of Roosevelt's goals. This was to ensure something like this Great Depression does not occur again
- 19. Congress reluctantly passed this law which gave limited powers for administrative reforms, including the key new Executive Office in the White House

- 20. barred federal administrative officials, except the highest policy-making officers, from active political campaigning and soliciting and forbade use of government funds for political purposes, as well as collection of campaign contributions from people receiving relief payments

- 2. Popular president during the Great Depression who worked with the New Deal Congress to help the US get through the depression
- 3. Create employment on useful projects such as buildings, bridges, etc.
- 4. Use of government spending and fiscal policy to "prime the pump" of the economy and encourage consumer spending
- 6. The group of people that worked with Roosevelt to address the depression. Hint: The "brains" of the operation
- 7. This British Economist recommended that Roosevelt look at the economy differently than he has been regarding the deficit spending

- 8. One of the three R's of Roosevelt's goals. This was immediate help provided to the people of America
- 10. Determined to discover how much the production and distribution of electricity costed. Created fair electricity rates
- 11. Protect public from fraud, deception, and inside manipulation
- 12. Made millions of dollars available to farmers to help them meet their mortgages. Established "parity prices" to give products real value. This was declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court
- 17. Created hours cap for laborers and a minimum wage. Created fair competition between individual industries. Declared unconstitutional by Supreme Court
- 18. Provided work in fresh-air government camps for 3 million people
