

- 7. South Vietnamese president during the start of the war whom President Lyndon B. Johnson called "the Winston Churchill of Asia".
- **9.** Vietnamese communist and revolutionary leader.
- **11.** One of the major entry points to South Vietnam of the Ho Chi Minh Trail.
- **12.** The chairman of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam.
- **14.** A General, Commander in Chief of the Vietnam People's Army (VNA) and Vietnamese politician. He played a major role as a commander in the First Indochina War

- **16.** U.S. bombing raid of North Vietnamese from 1965 1968.
- **17.** The last president of the Republic of Vietnam.
- **18.** Most casualties on both sides of the war. 5,000 deaths.
- **19.** A contingent of more than one thousand Vietcong attacked three battalions of South Vietnamese troops.
- **20.** It was the first major battle[8] between the United States Army and the North Vietnamese Army-NVA

- 1. A battle of the Vietnam War that was fought by the United States and South Vietnam against North Vietnamese forces from May 10-20, 1969 (main part of Operation Apache Snow).
- 3. The Leadership Committee Chairman (1965-1967) and President of the Republic of Vietnam (1967-1975).

- **5.** He replaced General Crieghton Abrams as MACV commander.
- 6. U.S. Commander in Vietnam, 1968-72.
- **8.** Commander of the U.S. Military Assistance Command in Vietnam (MACV)
- 10. Took place in a rubber plantation near Long Tan, in Phuoc Tuy Province, South Vietnam during the Vietnam War.
- 13. a senior army officer and a former politician of Republic of Vietnam. He served as a prime minister (1965-1967) and Vice President (1967-1971) of the Republic of Vietnam.
- **15.** Served as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and then spent a year as ambassador to South Vietnam.
