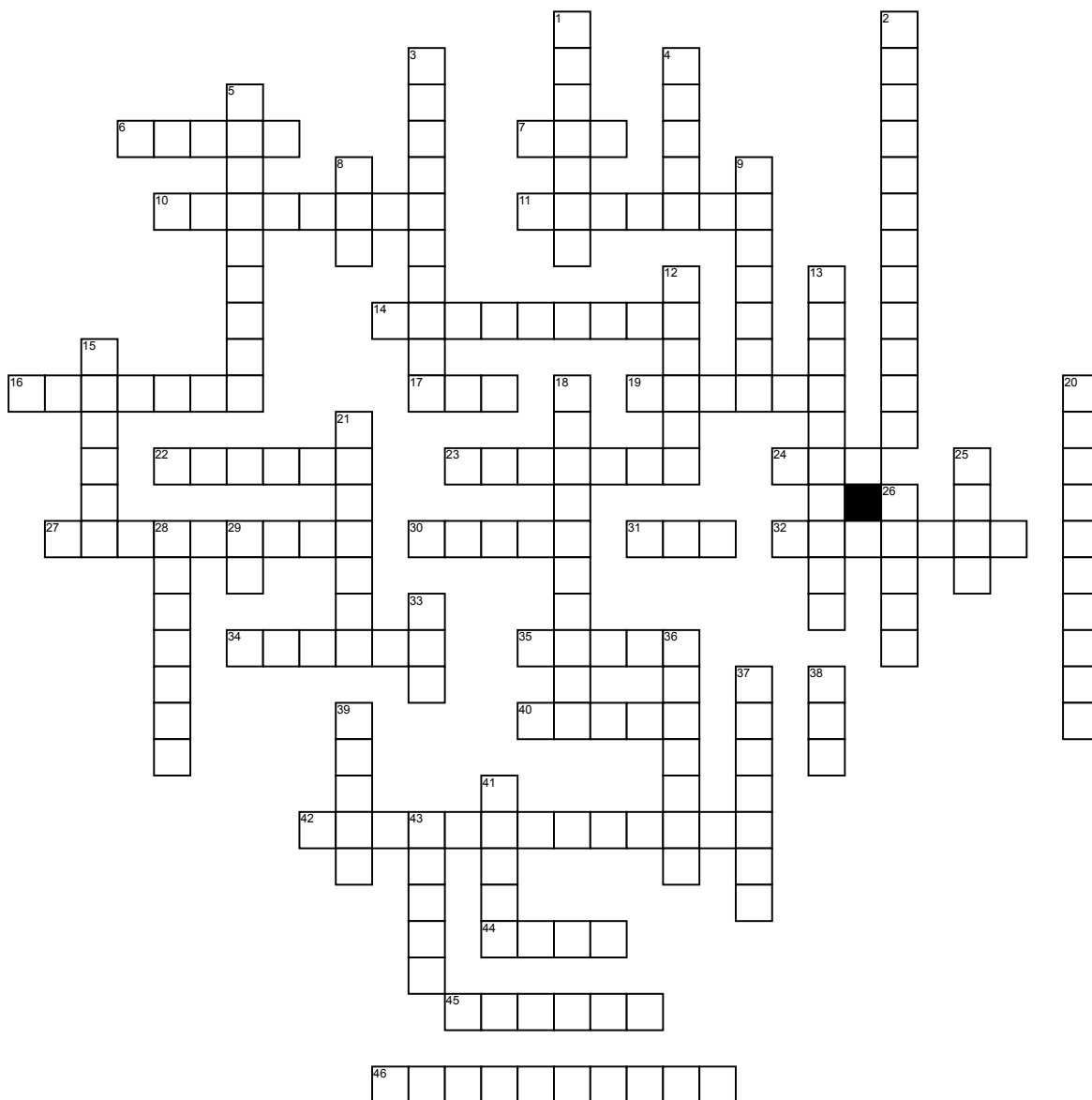


# Vintage Italian Racing Bikes

7. Top of the line Columbus tubing with spiral reinforcements to enhance rigidity  
10. Campagnolo group set to succeed Gran Sport; Paris' Arc de  
11. The world's oldest bike manufacturer still in existence founded in 1885  
14. Colnago top model from the mid 80's know for its elaborate and ornate chrome lugs  
16. This famous 80's Pinarello model was named after the town/area of production  
17. Gold-plated bicycle components and models  
19. Founded in 1906, with a two word name with the second being the founding location of Triestina, the first word was an acronym for the Italian phrase 'Long live Italy, liberated and redeemed'  
22. Campagnolo first name  
23. Founded in 1931 in Turin, this bicycle pioneer tried expanding his markets from Italy to Mexico and Venezuela  
24. This Moser Pro model was followed by the 'new' Pro model  
27. This founder of his own brand won achieved the rare Giro d'Italia-Vuelta a Espana double in 1981.  
30. Italian bike component manufacturer founded in 1919 by Fernando Michelin

5. Colnago model for Pope John Paul II  
8. The parts manufacturer Gipiemme was the spelling of this acronym  
9. Maker of high-end bike parts and the Supercorsa frame  
12. A lighter version of the Colnago Super with Columbus KL tubes  
13. Va Por La Hora

15. Manufacturer of chains, freewheels and clusters, founded in 1919, well known in 60's through 80's  
18. Campagnolo groupset named after an Italian Dolomites pass dropped because nobody could pronounce it  
20. Paolo and Italo - Paolo's name is pantographed on the bikes

25. The middle word of the 3ttt contaction  
26. The C in Campagnolo's C-Record  
28. Term referring to the 3 main tubes of the bicycle triangle
