
## Violence related definitions

4. hysical, sexual, emotional, or verbal abuse from a romantic or sexual partner
6. The permission that is or is not given for something to happen. Should be clearly and freely communicated.

**9.** Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical harassment of a sexual nature in the workplace, learning or living environment.

**10.** Pattern of behaviors used to maintain power/control over another partner. Includes the use of physical & sexual violence, threats, intimidation, emotional abuse and economic deprivation

1. Sexual contact or behavior that occurs without explicit consent of the victim. Includes rape and unwanted sexual touching of any kind

**2.** physical, social, or psychological harm imposed by a current or former partner or spouse.

**5.** Stalking via the Internet, e-mail, chat rooms, and social media.

7. Harassing behaviors such as following or spying on a person and making verbal, written, or implied threats. A course of conduct that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety

8. When a bias against another person's race or ethnicity, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, or disability motivates a criminal act. Many go unreported.
