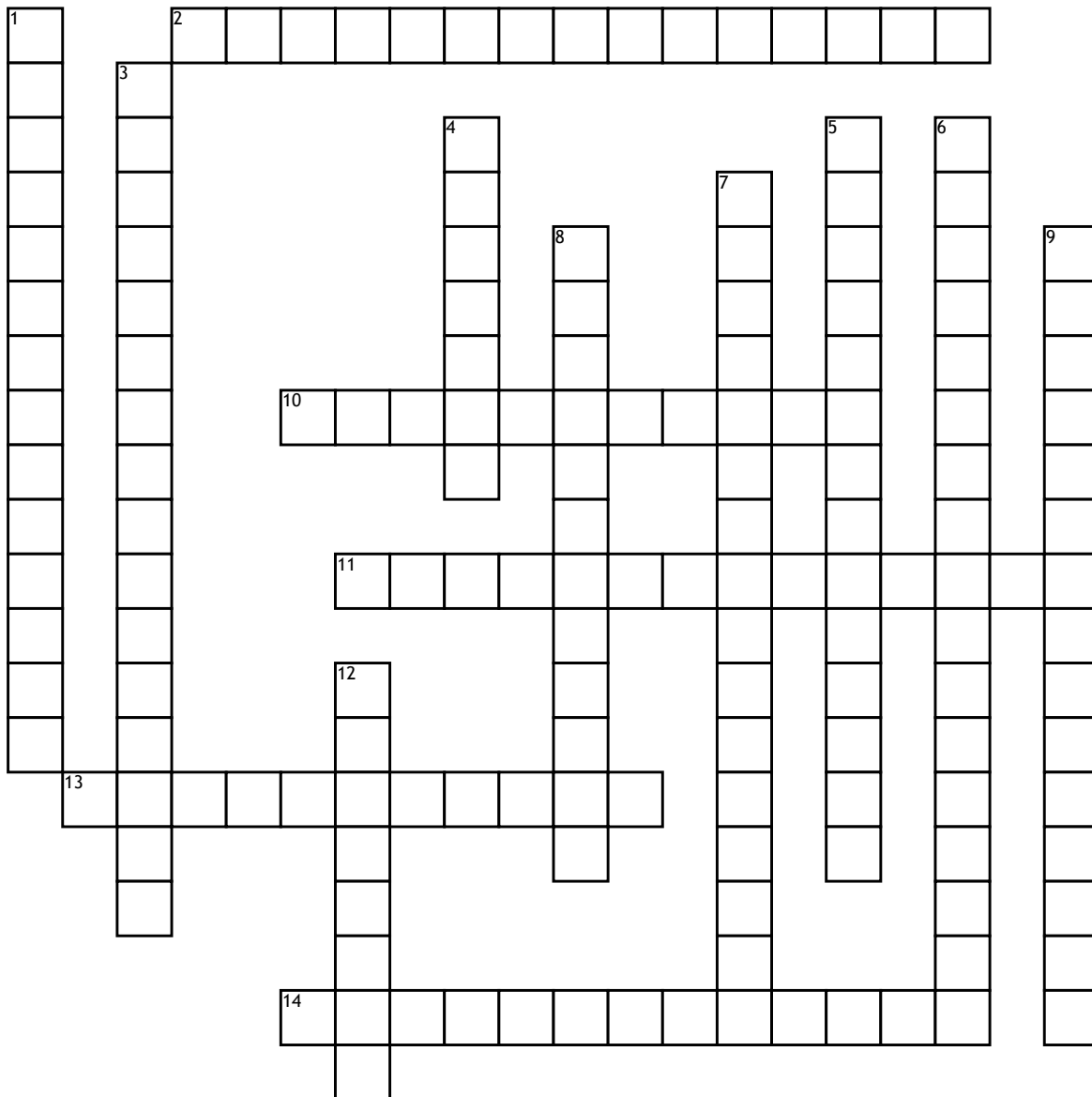

## Across

2. When drawings are recognizable to the viewer and artist  
 10. Point of view created by techniques such as size and overlapping  
 11. At 3 years old, a child's drawing begins to exhibit form and organization  
 13. Arrangement of the design and space  
 14. The early stage of artistic development that includes scribbles produced by a young child

## Down

1. The fourth stage of artistic development that occurs from 7-9 years old. Children continue to develop symbols to represent the world "realistically" and experiment with detail, placement, and material.

3. Relates to creations developed relative to how objects/subjects are seen through observation  
 4. The fifth stage of artistic development that occurs from 9-12 years old. Children become more concerned about realism in their art through size, proportion, placement, shape, color, and perspective  
 5. The hemisphere of the brain that specializes in logical operations  
 6. The third stage of artistic development that occurs at approximately 4-7 years old. This step involves exploration, gathering information, finding available resources, and getting acquainted with the "problem" or "issue"

7. The association among things in space, whether these are lines or shapes on a page, or among objects or parts of objects in three-dimensional space.  
 8. Art curriculum with specific goals and standards taught by art educators who have specialized training related to the content of art.  
 9. The hemisphere that is the visual spatial portion of the brain  
 12. Artwork emphasizing shapes, color, lines, and texture over subject matter
