

- 1. point of view used when the narrator knows everything and can see inside the minds of every character
- 2. used when the point of view is limited to only one character of a story; the narrator only knows what that character knows
- 4. point of view used when the narrator can follow multiple characters in the story (switching from one character's view point to another)
- 5. the reason an author decides to write about a specific topic
- 7. technique an author uses to hold the attention of pleasantly or agreeably; divert; amuse

- 8. point of view used when your narrator is not a character in the story; uses "he/she/it" narrator and it is the most commonly used POV in writing.
- 10. technique an author uses to give or impart knowledge of a fact or circumstance
- 11. the main statement of a poem, an essay, a short story, or a novel that usually appears as an introduction or a point on which the writer will develop his work in order to convince his readers
- 13. technique that writers use to present their ideas through reasons and logic to influence the audience; uses arguments to prompt the readers to perform a certain action or change their opinion about a specific issue
