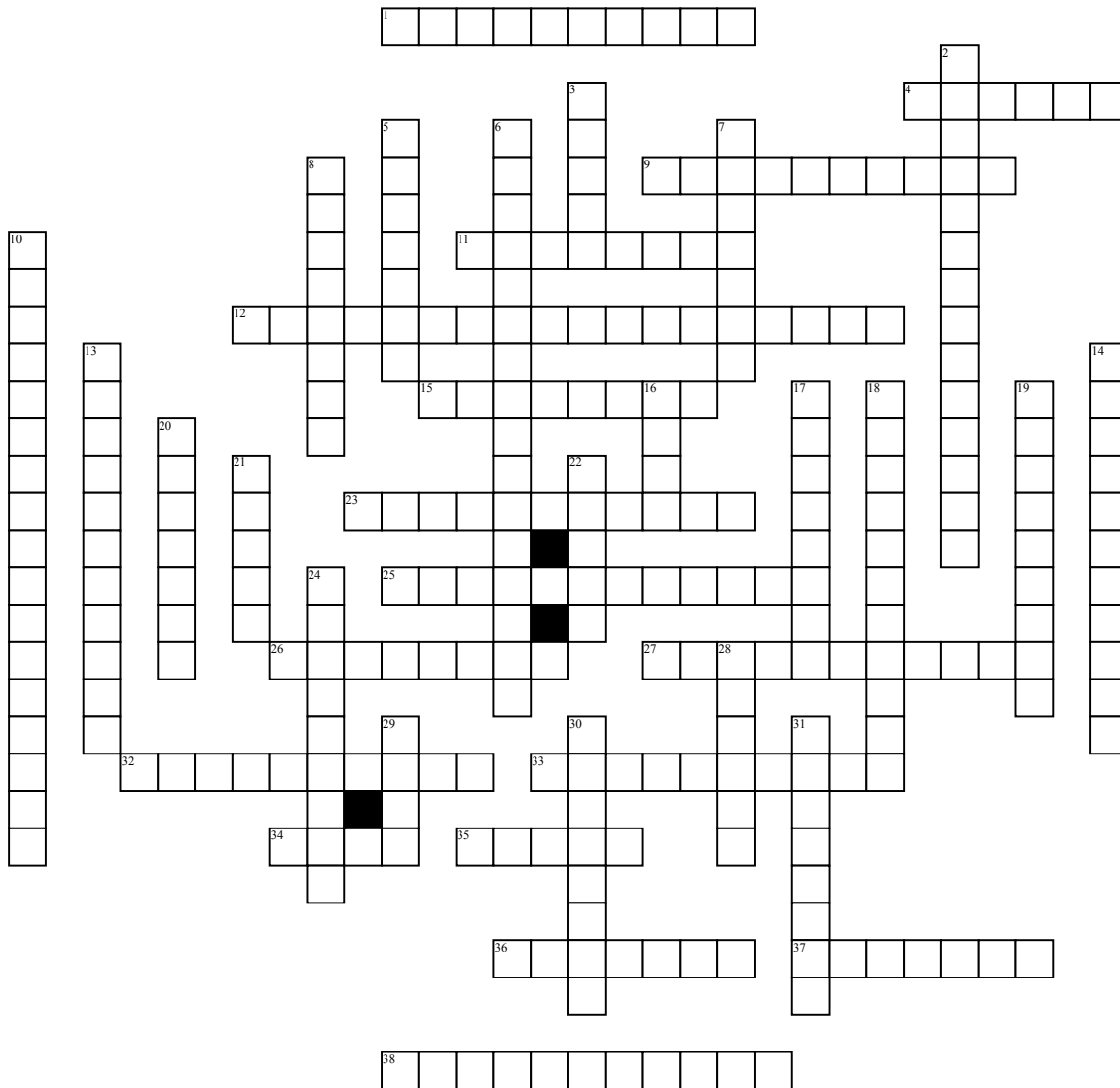

6. Basilica and Expiatory Church
7. an ornamental molding around the wall of a room just below the ceiling
8. a central stone at the summit of an arch, locking the whole together.

14. the ruins of an ancient Mayan city, in central Yucatán state, Mexico.
16. a curved symmetrical structure spanning an opening and typically supporting the weight of a bridge, roof, or wall above it.

18. a horizontal, continuous lintel on a classical building supported by columns or a wall, comprising the architrave, frieze, and cornice.
