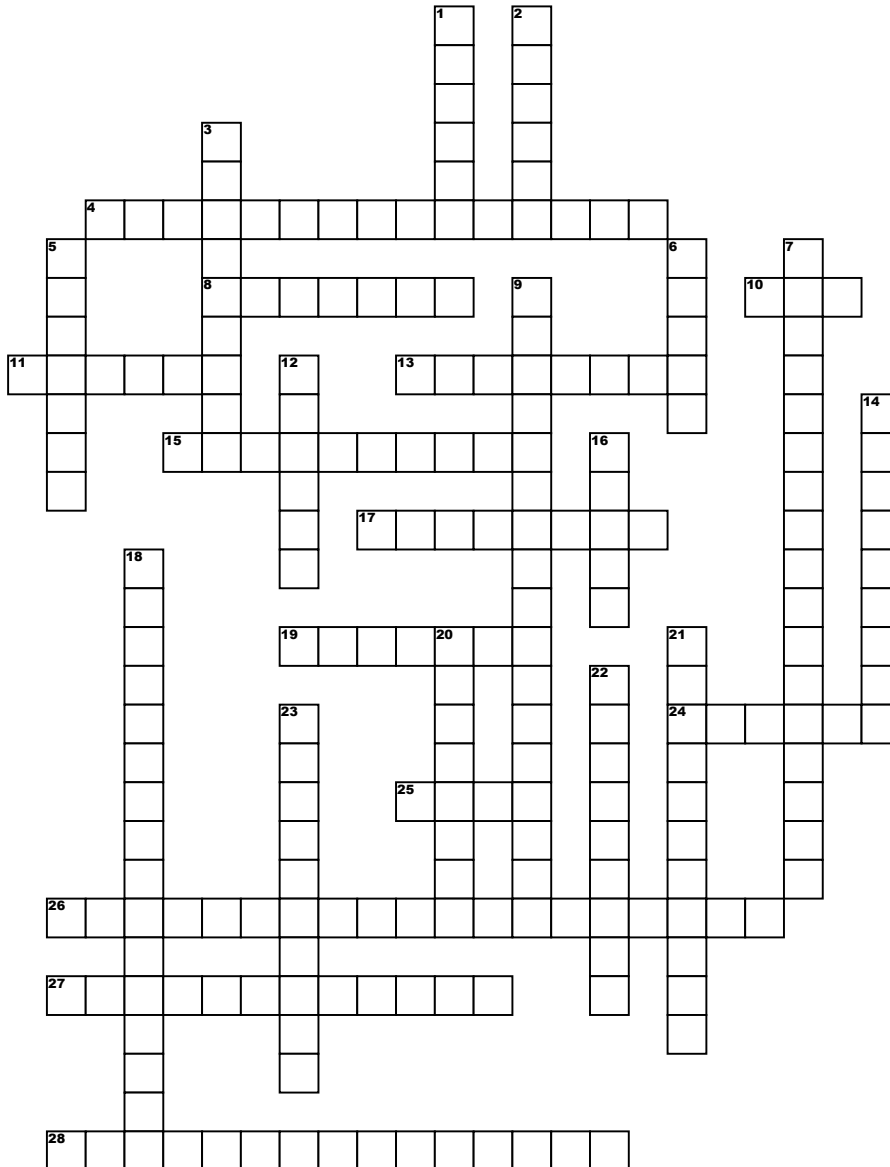

4. vertical seated position in which the back of the dental chair is upright at a 90 degree angle
8. Pertaining to selected teeth visible through the dam; isolated.
10. A steel or tungsten carbide rotary cutting instrument
11. Blades on the working end of a finishing rotary instrument that resemble pleats.
13. Having notchlike projections that extend from a flat surface.
15. Referring to mechanical radiant energy of water and sound vibrations used to break down material or tissue
17. foot controlled device used to operate dental hand pieces
19. Having a sense of touch or feeling.
24. laying down position in which patients head chest and knees are at the same level
25. Part of a clamp that is shaped into four prongs to help stabilize the clamp on the tooth.

26. process by which the operator and assistant work together to perform clinical procedures in an ergonomically structured environment

27. Microscopic space located at the interface of the tooth structure and the sealant or restoration.

28. An electrical instrument used to hold rotary instruments.

1. Internal reaction or resistance to an externally applied force.
2. To reverse the position, order, or condition. To turn inside out or upside down.
3. Pertaining to the same clamp that can be placed on the same type of tooth in the opposite quadrant.
5. An alloy, with one of the constituents being mercury.
6. Flat edge of instrument, sharp enough to cut.
7. laying down position in which the patients head is lower than the feet used in emergency situations

9. level of supervision in which the dentist is physically present when the auxiliary performs delegated functions

12. Twisting or turning force

14. the process of mechanically mixing a material as when an amalgamator is used to mix an alloy and mercury to create dental amalgam

16. Part of an instrument where the handle attaches to the working end.

18. specific intraoral functions delegated to an auxiliary that requires advanced skill and training

20. Pertaining to selected teeth visible through the dam; exposed.

21. To restore or bring back to its natural appearance

22. The act of holding something by means of an adhesive, or mechanical locking, or both.

23. Part of a dental instrument that is used on the tooth or when dental materials are mixed
