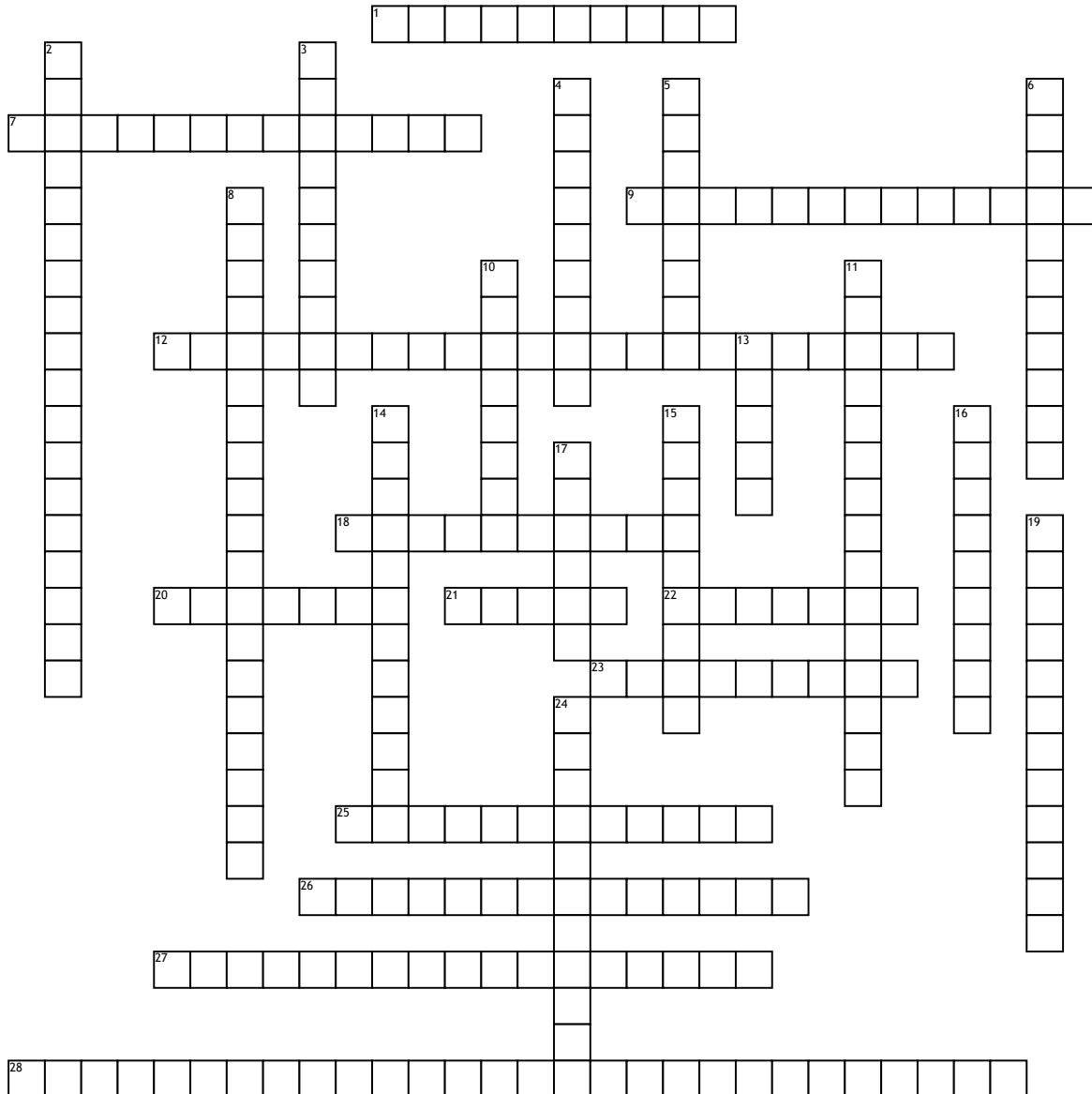


# WORLD WAR I
