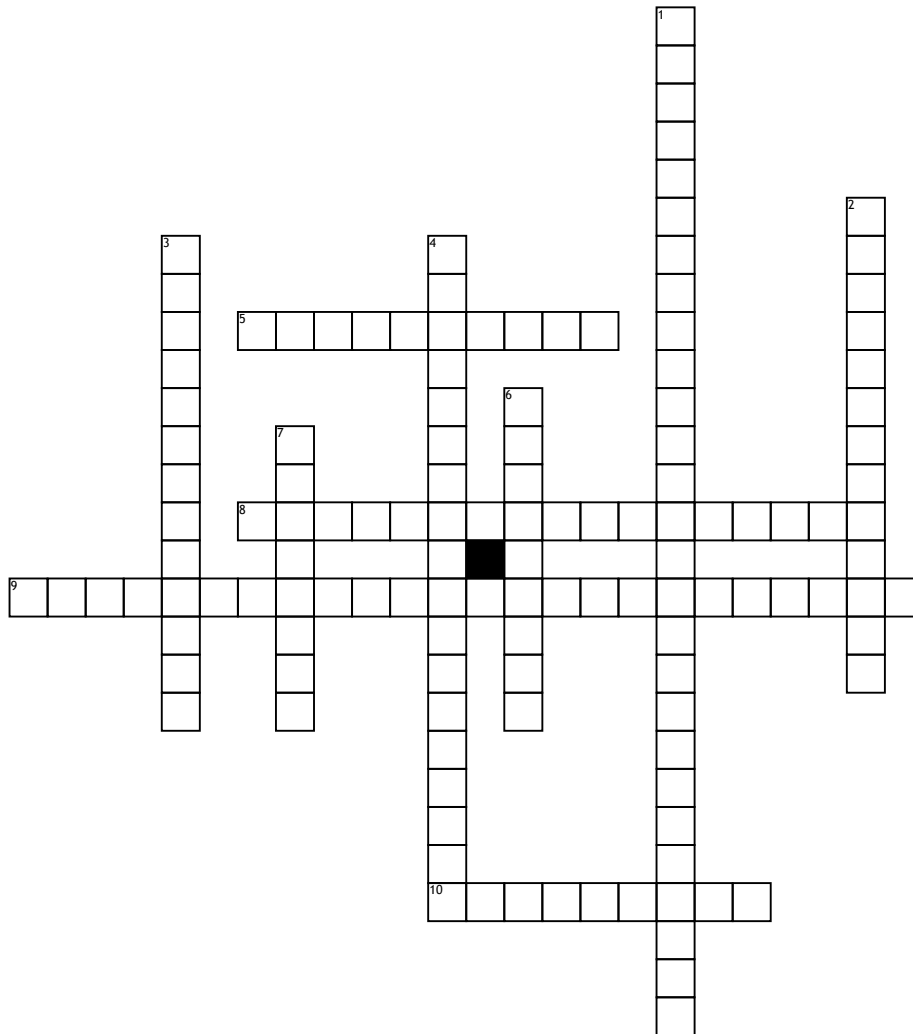


Westward Expansion Vocabulary
