

Window and Door Terminology



Across

- **4.** This window has side hinges that crank outward from either the left or right.
- **6.** The vertical members at the side of the frame.
- **8.** Window units with one or more curved frame members.
- **11.** A fixed framed window made up of 3 or more angles.
- **12.** Framework of stiles and rails in which the glass of a window is set.
- **13.** Horizontal member at the bottom of a window frame.

- **14.** Hinged at the top, this window has a single sash that swings outward from the bottom.
- **15.** A window where the glass is glazed directly into the frame.

Down

- **1.** A window where the top sash is fixed and bottom sash moves vertically.
- **2.** A framed opening in which a window or door will be installed.

- **3.** A board used to increase the depth of the jambs of a window frame to fit a wall of any given thickness.
- **5.** Limits a window opening to 4" while providing full egress.
- **7.** A window with two vertically moving sashes, each closing a different part of the window.
- **9.** Metal grid in between the panes of an insulating glass unit.
- **10.** To join two or more windows together.
