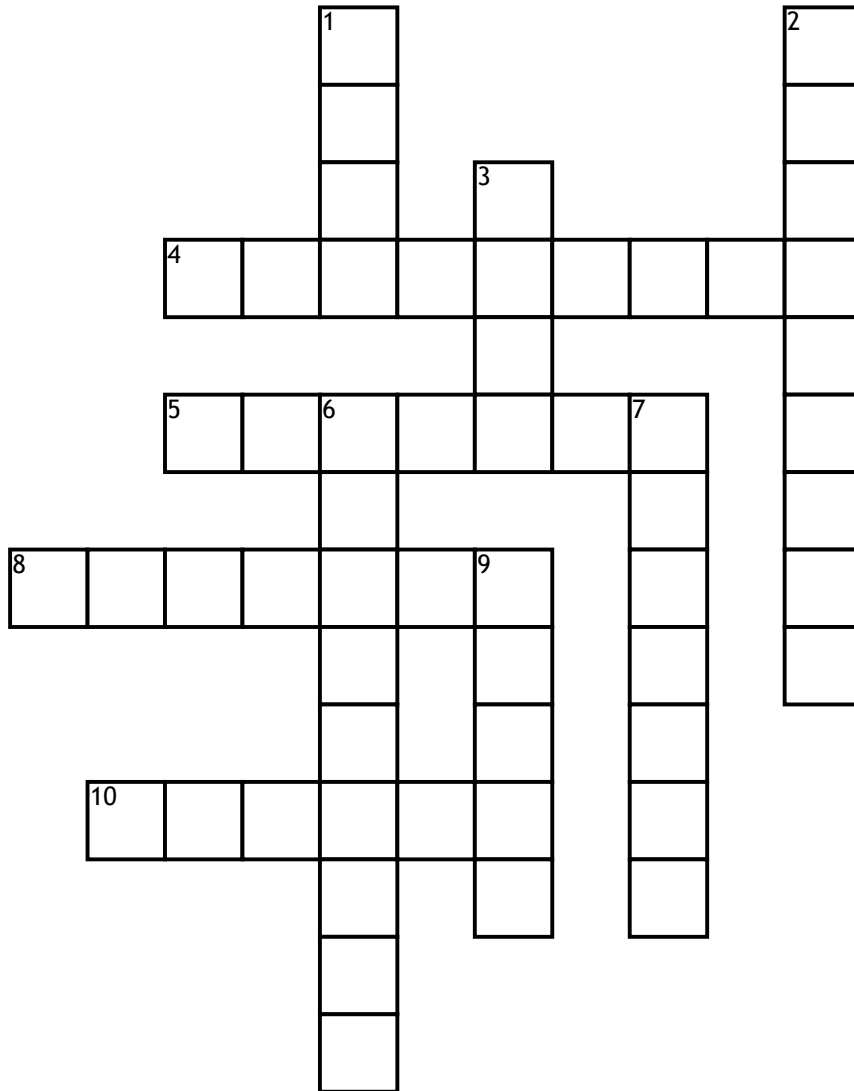


# Wisconsin Book--Lesson 1 Vocabulary

- 1. Fine soft particles of soil that settle in the bottoms of lakes and rivers form this.

- 2. This is the place where a river first starts and is often just a small stream.
- 3. The area of Wisconsin that was never covered by glaciers is called this. DRIFTLESS
- 6. This is a stream that flows into a larger waterway such as a river.
- 7. A long glacial hill that looks like a teardrop of overturned canoe is called this.
