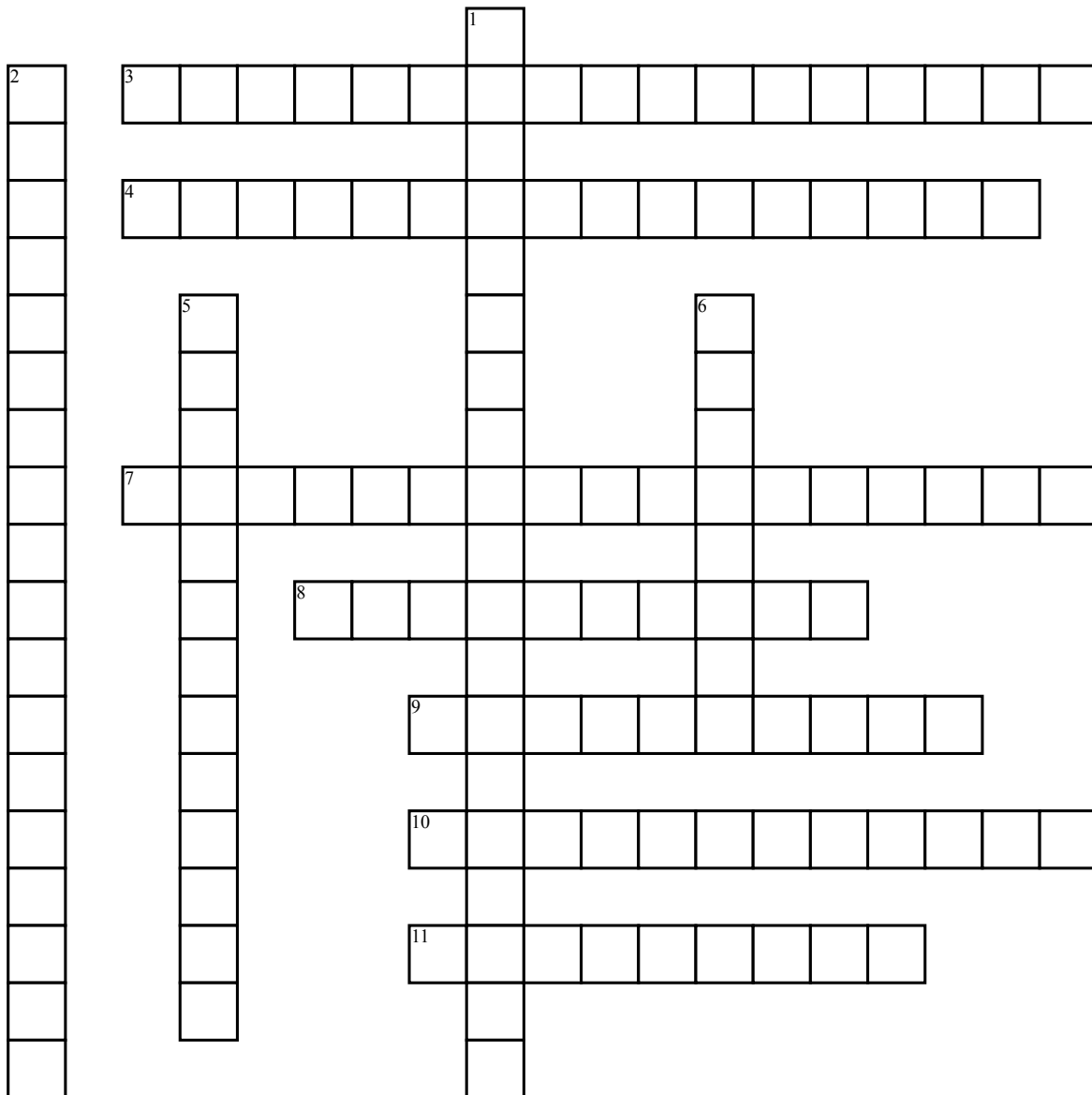

- 1. a theory of voting n which voters essentially ask this simple question
- 2. A process permitted in some states whereby voters may put proposed changes in the state constitution to a vote if sufficient signatures are obtained on petitions calling for such a referendum
- 5. passed in 1993, this act went into effect for the 1996 election. It requires states to permit people to register to vote at the same time they apply for their driver's license
- 6. the legal right to vote
