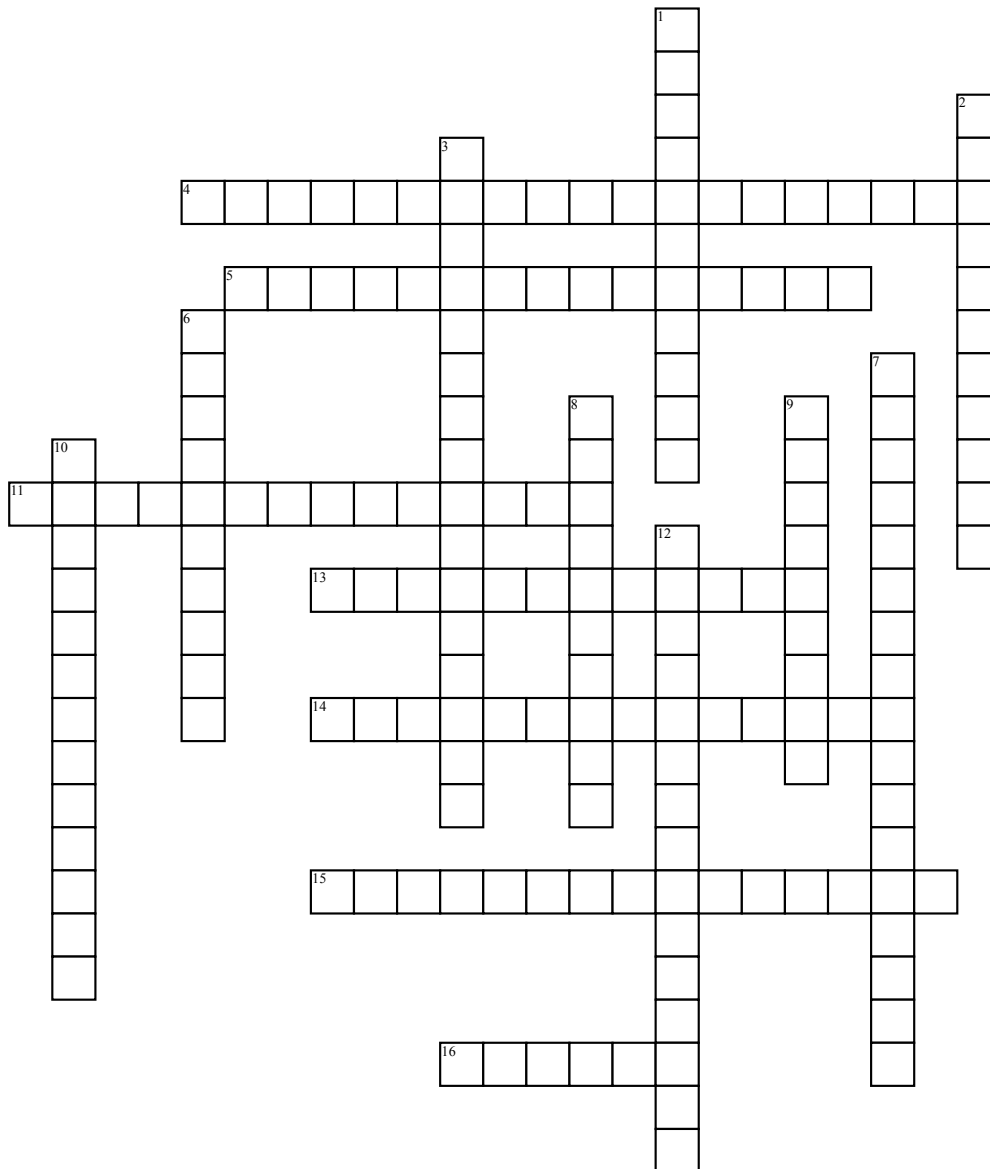


# World War 1

- 5. international organization established after World War I under the provisions of the Treaty of Versailles
- 11. a statement of principles for world peace that was to be used for peace negotiations in order to end World War I
- 13. a person who for reasons of conscience refuses to take part in warfare
- 14. movement of 6 million African-Americans out of the rural Southern United States to the urban Northeast, Midwest, and West that occurred between 1910 and 1970

- 15. any of two or more ideas, facts, or statements that cannot be made compatible.
  - 16. a German submarine used in World War I or World War II

- 1. anything paid or done to make up for a wrongdoing
  - 2. being devoted to your country, or the feeling that nations should act independently instead of working together
  - 3. units are activated under temporary orders by the owning MAJCOM for a specific purpose or mission
  - 6. belief that a strong military force should be maintained and used aggressively to defend or promote national interests

- 7. was an internal diplomatic communication issued from the German Foreign Office in January 1917 that proposed a military alliance between Germany and Mexico in the event of the United States' entering World War I against Germany.

- 9. a British luxury liner sunk by a German submarine in the North Atlantic on May 7, 1915
- 10. a person who refuses to serve in the armed forces or bear arms on moral or religious grounds
- 12. a group of Senators, led by Henry Cabot Lodge, who opposed the Treaty of Versailles, to end WWI unless specific changes were included
