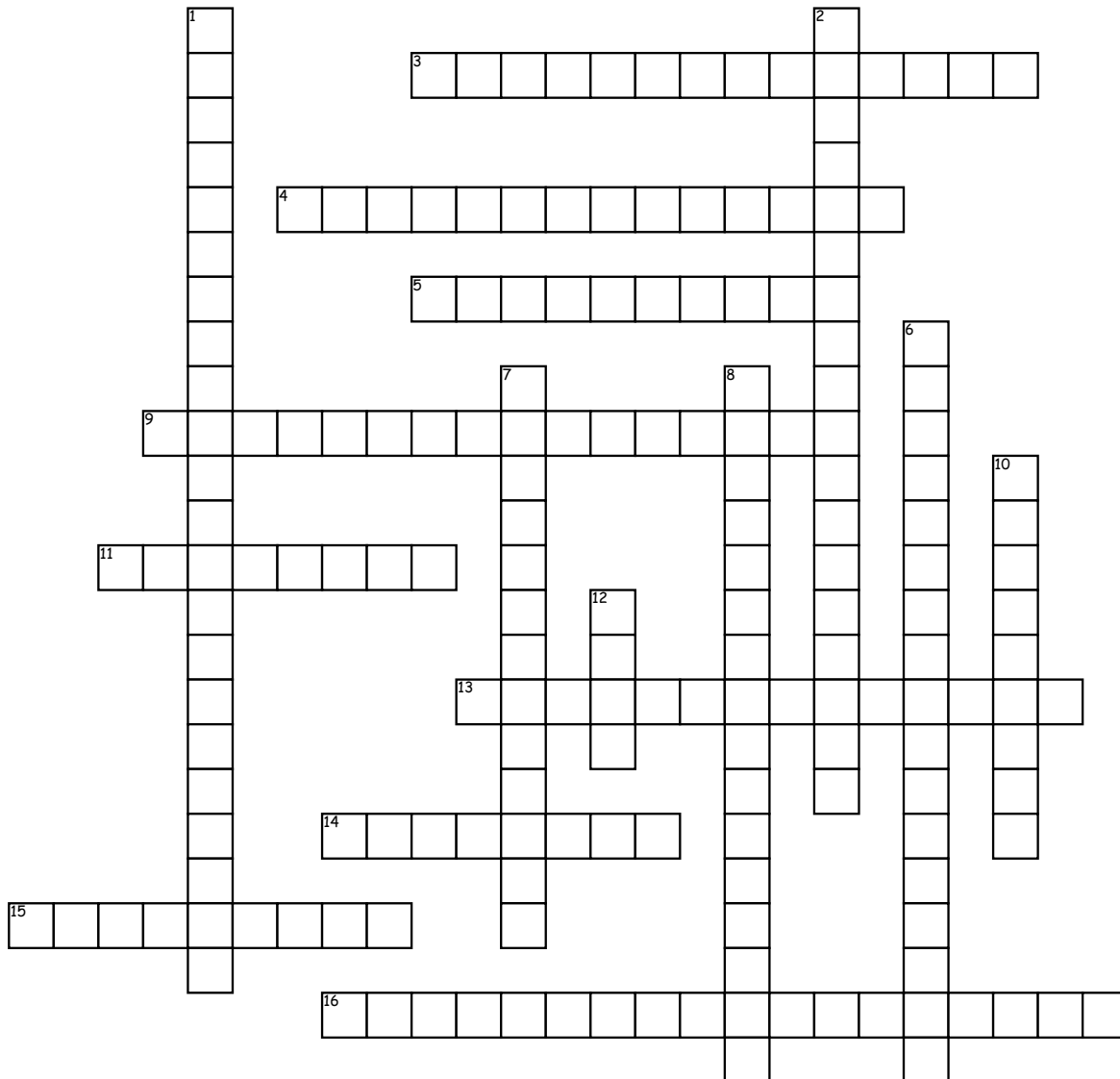

3. a series of laws and diplomatic agreements, initiated on August 4, 1942, when the United States signed the Mexican Farm Labor Agreement with Mexico.

4. were the first black servicemen to serve as military aviators in the U.S. armed forces, flying with distinction during World War II.

5. the burial of a corpse in a grave or tomb, typically with funeral rites.

9. a research and development undertaking during World War II that produced the first nuclear weapons

11. the deliberate killing of a large group of people, especially those of a particular ethnic group or nation.

13. Took place in the Pacific Theater of War, and is considered the most important battle in the Pacific.

14. consists of debt securities issued by a government for the purpose of financing military operations during times of war.

15. The process of a governing body controlling the issuance of goods and services to the public.

16. A United States presidential executive order signed and issued during World War II by United States President Franklin D. Roosevelt on February 19, 1942.

1. a United States government agency created during World War II to consolidate existing government information services and deliver propaganda both at home and abroad

7. an international organization formed in 1945 to increase political and economic cooperation among member countries.

8. a series of treaties, between on the treatment of civilians, prisoners of war (POWs) and soldiers who are otherwise rendered hors de combat, or incapable of fighting.
