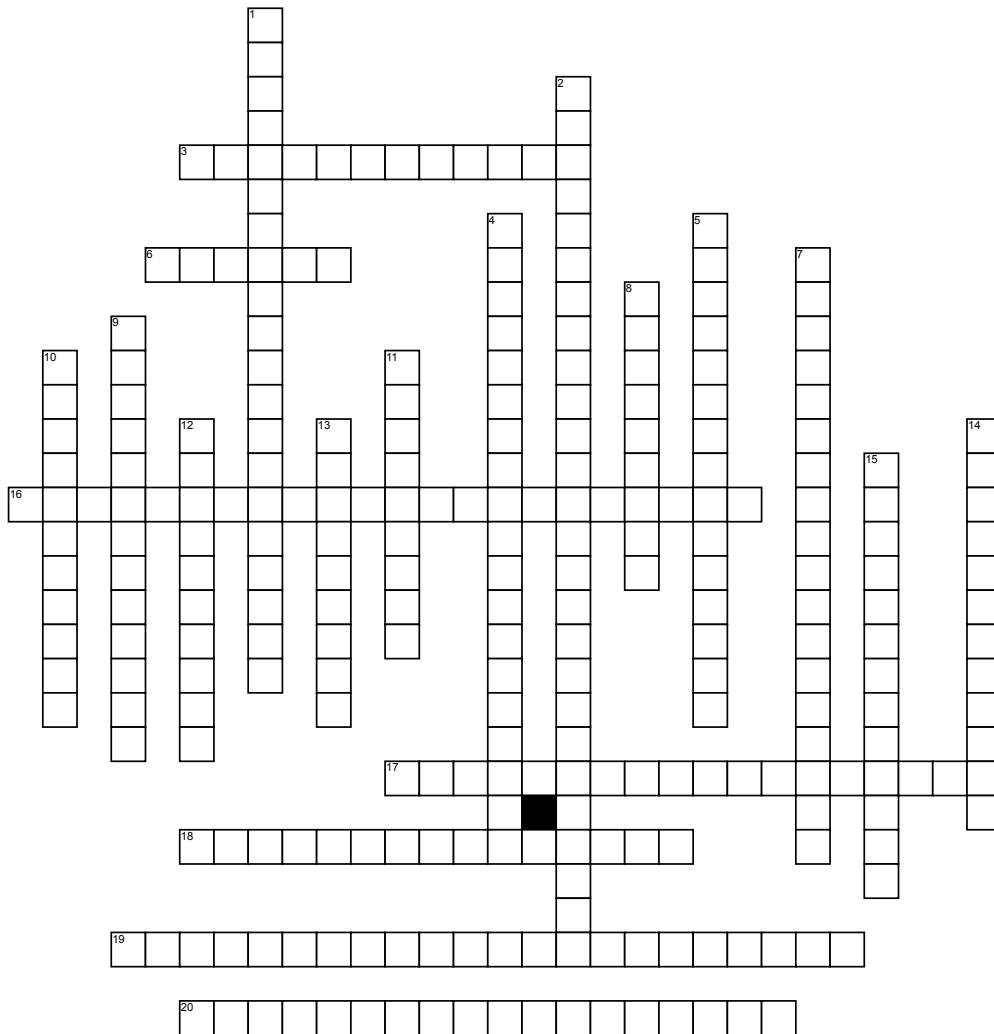

- 3. a promise made by Germany to the United States in 1916, during World War I before the latter entered the war
- 6. a German submarine used in World War I or World War II.
- 16. the heir presumptive to the throne of Austria-Hungary
- 17. a treaty that terminated the American Revolution in 1783
- 18. an American Republican politician, historian, and statesman from Massachusetts
- 19. a statement of principles for peace that was to be used for peace negotiations in order to end World War I
- 20. a United States federal law passed on June 15, 1917, shortly after the U.S. entry into World War I

- 1. the formal meeting in 1919 and 1920 of the victorious Allies after the end of World War I to set the peace terms for the defeated Central Powers
- 2. was a formation of the United States Army on the Western Front of World War I
- 4. authorized the United States federal government to raise a national army for service in World War I through conscription
- 5. the first worldwide intergovernmental organisation whose principal mission was to maintain world peace
- 7. a secret diplomatic communication issued from the German Foreign Office in January 1917 that proposed a military alliance between Germany and Mexico
- 8. a British ocean liner that was sunk on 7 May 1915 by a German U-boat 11 miles off the southern coast of Ireland, killing 1,198 passengers and crew

- 9. a type of land warfare using occupied fighting lines largely comprising military trenches
- 10. the making of amends for a wrong one has done, by paying money to or otherwise helping those who have been wronged
- 11. also known as Sergeant York, was one of the most decorated United States Army soldiers of World War I
- 12. the state of not supporting or helping either side in a conflict, disagreement, etc.; impartiality
- 13. a global war originating in Europe that lasted from 28 July 1914 to 11 November 1918
- 14. a policy of remaining apart from the affairs or interests of other groups, especially the political affairs of other countries
- 15. an American politician and academic who served as the 28th president of the United States from 1913 to 1921
