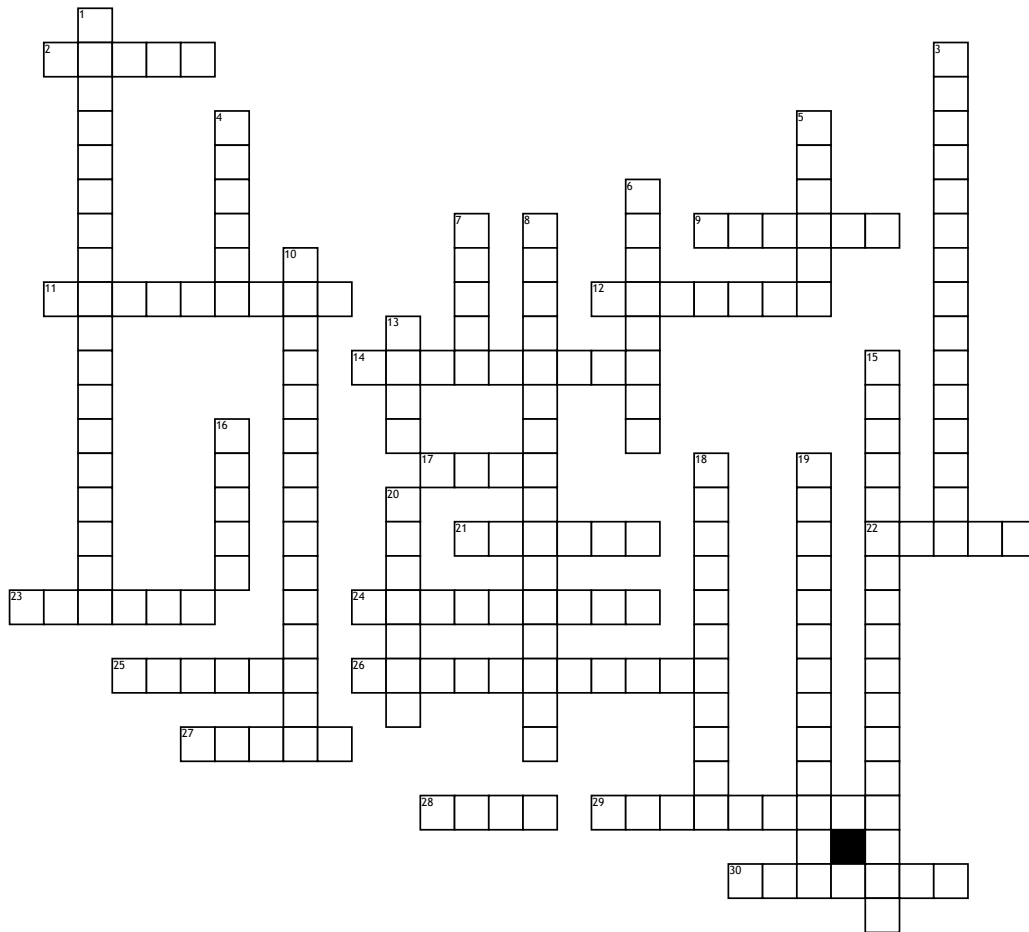

- 1. Was the removal and detainment of Japanese Canadians from the British Columbia coast following the Japanese invasion of Hong Kong and Malaya and attack on Pearl Harbour, and the subsequent Canadian declaration of war on Japan during World War II.
 - 3. Was a military campaign of the Second World War, in which the Royal Air Force defended the United Kingdom against large scale attacks by the German Air Force. It has been described as the first major military campaign fought entirely by air forces.
 - 4. This attack took place in the northern coast of France on 19 August 1942. The assault began at 5:00 a.m., and by 10:50 a.m.
 - 5. Another name associated with German submarines

- 6. Hirohito was the 124th Emperor of Japan according to the traditional order of succession, reigning from December 25, 1926, until his death.
