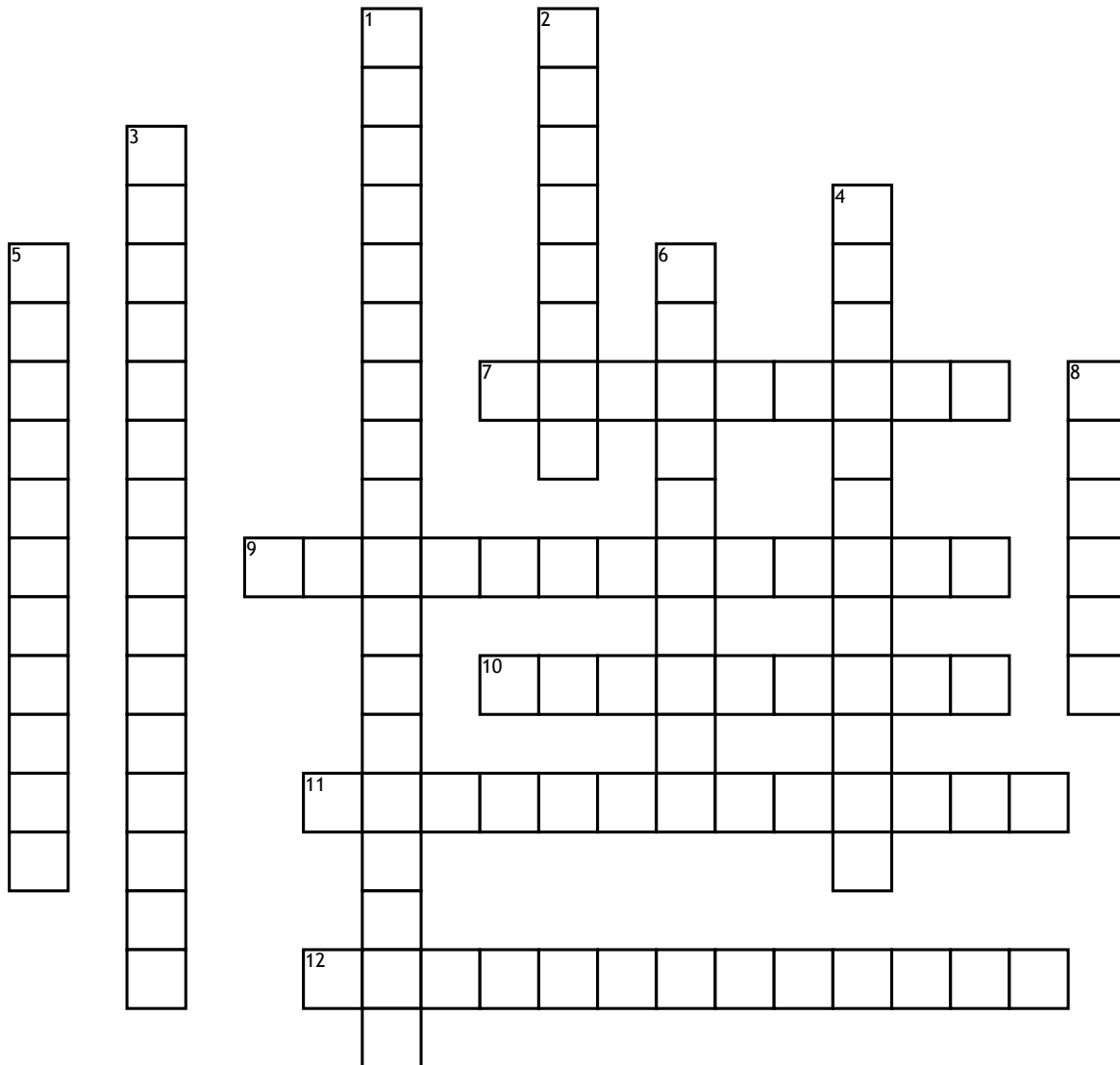


# World War one

1. (1919) Treaty ending World War I that required Germany to pay billions of dollars of war costs and established the League of Nations.

2. (1918) President Woodrow Wilson's plan for organizing post World War I Europe and for avoiding future wars.

3. International congress of nations formed in 1919 that was designed to settle disputes and maintain peace and collective security.

4. Payments for damages and expenses brought on by war.

5. The belief that a specific nation, language, or culture is superior to others.
