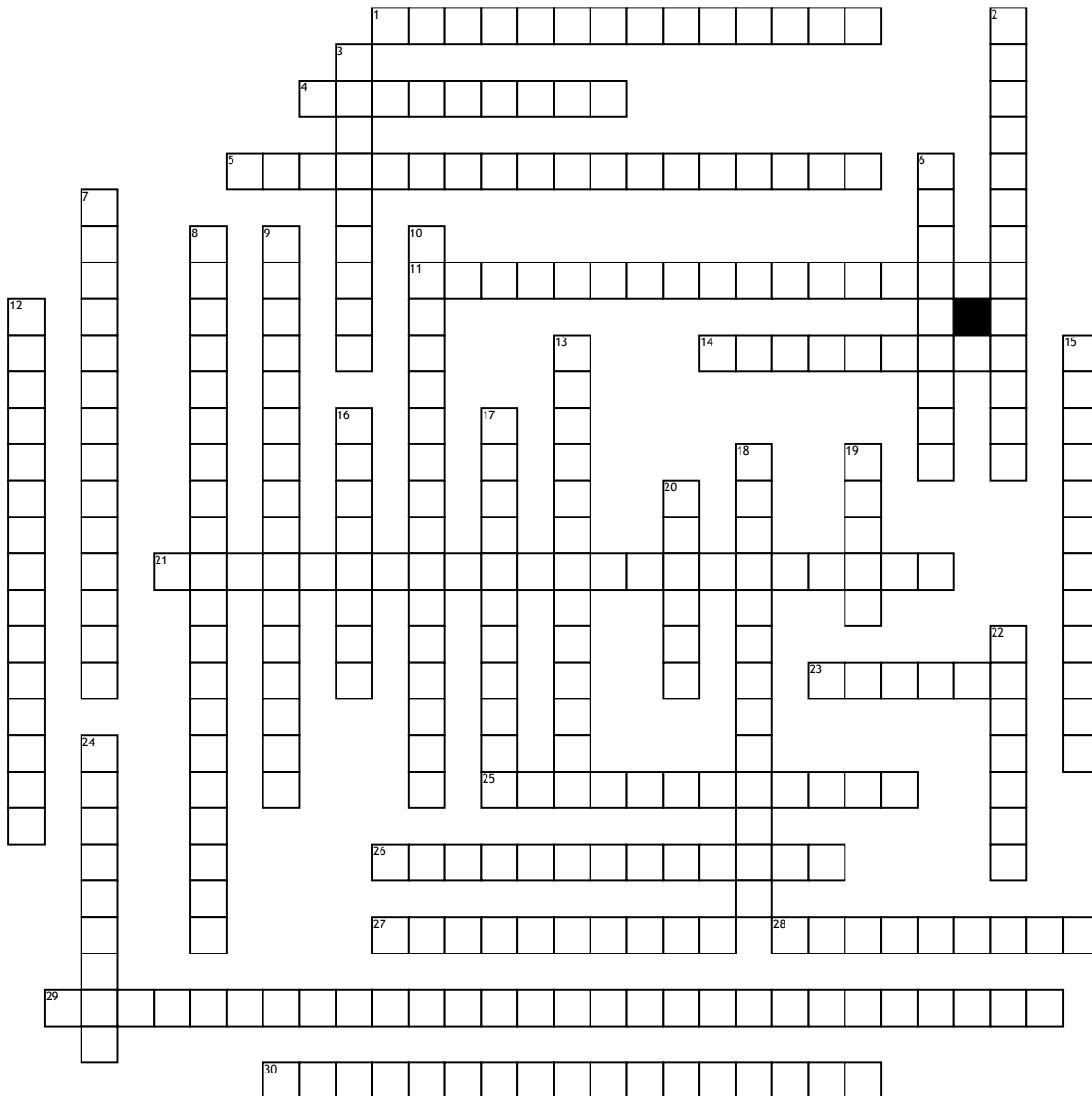


World war 1 vocab

1. Wilson's peace plan. Each of the points were designed to prevent future wars.
4. This word, meaning cease-fire, was proclaimed in November of 1918.
5. Created by the leaders victorious allied nations: France, Britain, Italy, and the US, and signed by Germany to help stop WWI.
11. The reason Russia dropped out of the war. A Communist overthrow of the Russian government. Russian war ended with the Treaty of Brest-Litovsk.
14. A deadlock in fighting in which neither side makes major gains. The Western Front was locked in this for most of the war.
21. The heir to the Austrian throne assassinated on June 28, 1914 Bosnia by Serbians.
23. German forces could focus here when Russia dropped out of the war.
25. Germany's Pledge to warn ships before sinking.
26. Note from Germany to Mexico offering to help take lands back in the United States. Intercepted by America.
27. America entered the war after the German's sunk
28. Germany lost this after the war.

29. Germany's use of submarines without warning.

30. A plan in which the Germans would invade Belgium and France using a wheel-like flanking procedure while the Russians mobilized.

2. Alliance among Britain, Russia, and France at the outset of the 20th century; part of European alliance system and balance of power prior to World War I.
3. This word for military and weapons is what Germany was forced to reduce in the Treaty of Versailles.
6. English cruise ship sunk without warning by a German U-Boat.
7. Alliance among Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy at the end of the 19th century; part of European alliance system and balance of power prior to World War I.
8. Treaty between Russia and Germany officially declaring Russia's exit of the war.
9. Battle at which the German advance into France was stopped and at which a stalemate developed.
10. Assault carried out by the Young Turks against the Armenian population in what is now Turkey and Syria beginning in 1915; over a million Armenians perished and thousands fled to Russia and the Middle East.
12. International diplomatic and peace organization created in the Treaty of Versailles that ended World War I.
13. Group of three Turkish military leaders who ruled the new nation of Turkey.
15. Front along the German, Austro-Hungarian, Russian, Balkan, and Turkish border.
16. Strip of land to the east of the Ottoman Empire in which Turkish forces fought the Russians.
17. Germany was forced to pay these for repairs.
18. 28th president of the United States, sought 14 point post-war plan for peace.
19. German submarine.
20. An in-ground fortification. These were used extensively on the Western Front.
22. This nation was forced to take responsibility for the war in the Treaty of Versailles.
24. The Serbian terrorist group that planned to assassinate Franz Ferdinand, part of the Pan-Slavic nationalist movement.
