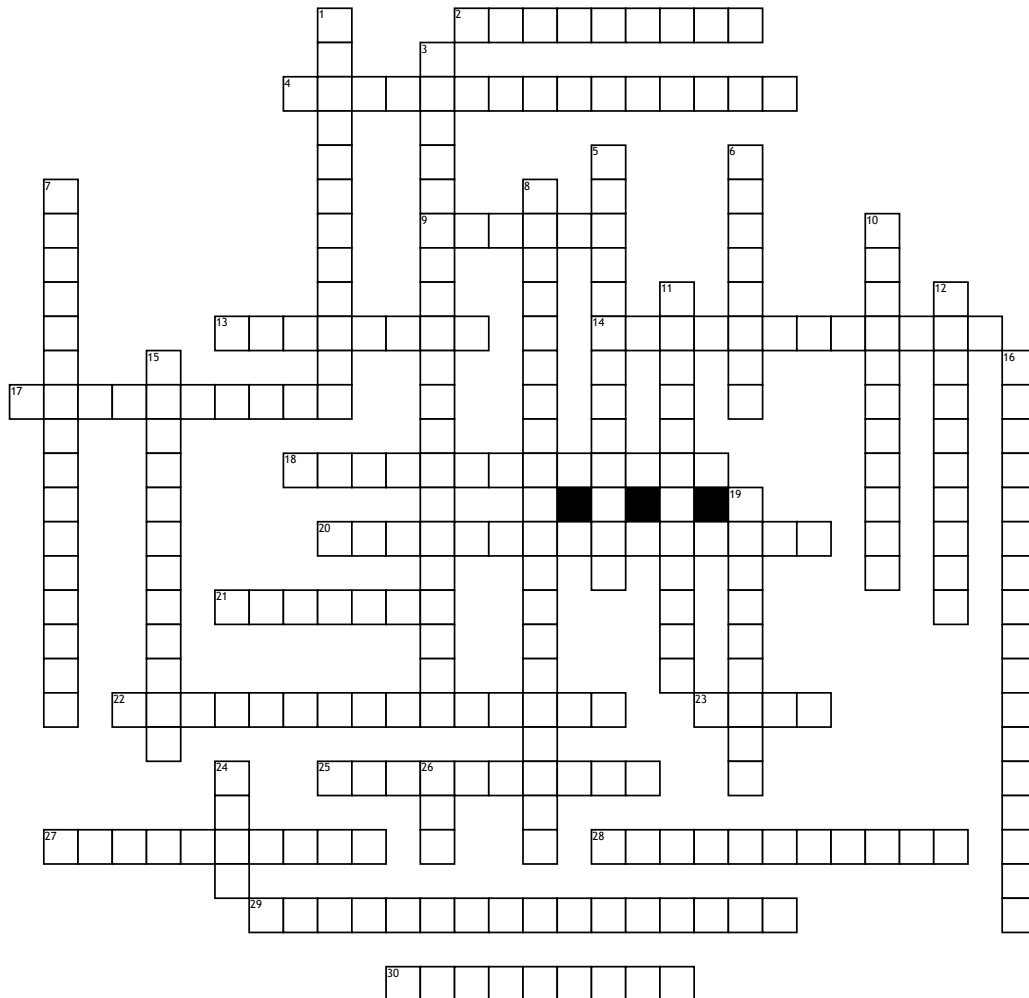

 - 30. a contribution of free labor, usually to a non-profit organization
