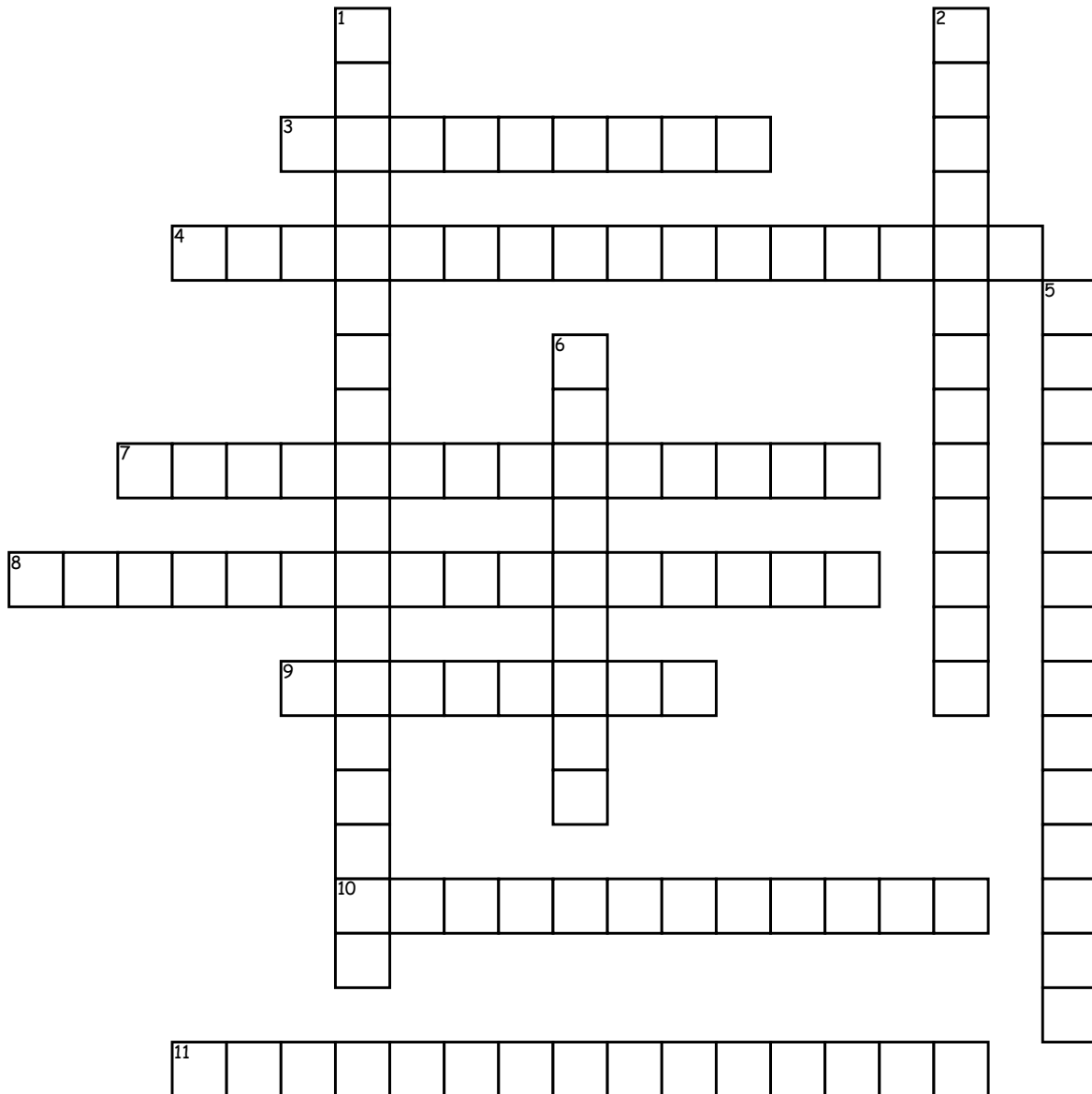

- 11. relationship between the quantity of a commodity that producers wish to sell at various prices and the quantity that consumers wish to buy.

- 1. the production of goods and services are based on a particular societies traditional customs or beliefs people will make what they have always made and do the same work their parents did; exchange of goods through bartering
- 2. an economic system in which economic decisions are guided by the changes in prices that occur as individual buyers and sellers interact in the marketplace to determine the sale of goods (based on what the people want and what they are willing to pay). based on free enterprise and competition
- 5. the central or state government determines the goods produced, prices of goods, service provided and the wages of workers
- 6. is the study of how people make decisions given the resources that are provided to them
