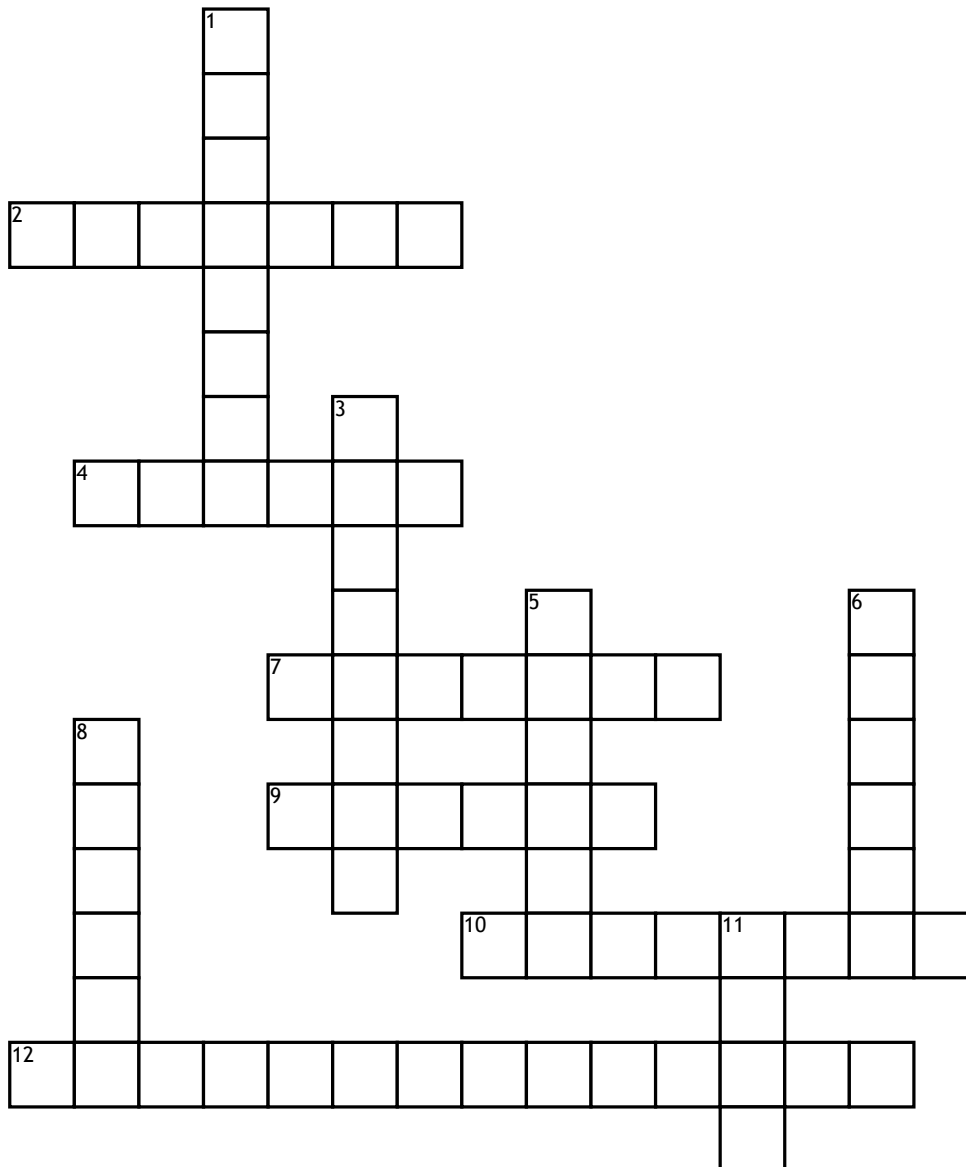

Across

2. Circumscribed raised lesions containing cloudy fluid. <0.5cm in diameter.

4. An area of skin raised slightly above the surrounding skin which is extensive, usually greater than 3cm across.

7. Damage to superficial skin capillaries that have leaked blood. Do not blanch.

9. Any change in colour or consistency, without elevation above the surface of surrounding skin. Does not blanch on pressure

10. Circumscribed raised lesions containing clear fluid. <0.5cm in diameter

12. Small permanently dilated blood vessels in the skin. Blanch, linear.

Down

1. Dilatation of the superficial skin capillaries, causing redness. Always blanches.

3. Flat disc like lesions of various sizes.

5. Circumscribed raised lesions containing clear fluid. >0.5cm in diameter

6. Circumscribed raised lesion <1cm in diameter

8. Circumscribed raised lesion >1cm in diameter.

11. A fluid filled cavity below the dermis. The above lesions are in the dermis
