

- 2. process of the union of the egg and sperm
- 9. short and narrow duct that begins where the ductus deferens and seminal duct join.
- 10. process of origin, growth, and formation of ovum in ovary during preparation for fertilization.
- 11. narrow end of uterus
- 12. mucous glands at opening of vagina.
- 13. recurring series of changes that take place in the ovaries, uterus, and accessory sexual structures during menstruation.

14. uterine tubes that carry the egg from the ovaries to the uterus, also called oviducts.

- 1. an infectious disease of the genitourinary tract caused by gonococcus bacteria; transmitted mainly by sexual contact
- large lips or folds of skin that lie on either side of the vaginal opening have adipose tissue and sweat glands
- 4. the absence of menstration
- 5. a sexually transmitted disease caused by the chlamydia trachomatis organism.

- are either benign or malignant; benign tumors are fluid-filled cysts which enlarge during the premenstrual period.
- 7. the part of the duct system of the testes that runs from the epididymis to the ejaculatory duct.
- 8. sexually transmitted disease; also human papillomavirus.
