

- 1. compromise reached between delegates from southern states and those from northern states
- **2.** the original constitution of the US, ratified in 1781, which was replaced by the US Constitution in 1789.
- **3.** in American history, uprising that afforded the new U.S. government its first opportunity to establish federal authority by military means within state boundaries to quell an uprising of settlers rebelling against the liquor tax
- **4.** territory of the US that lies between the Mississippi and Ohio rivers and the Great Lakes. It was acquired in 1783 after the American Revolution.

- **5.** first ten amendments to the US Constitution, ratified in 1791. rights as the freedoms
- **6.** four bills passed by the Federalist-dominated 5th United States Congress and signed into law by President John Adams
- **7.** A Federalist from Virginia, he is considered the father of the American system of constitutional law, especially of the doctrine of judicial review
- **8.** name given to a series of protests in 1786 and 1787 by American farmers against state and local enforcement of tax collections and judgments for debt.
- **10.** incident in Franco-American relations in which a bribery attempt perpetrated by French agents in 1797 led the US to the brink of formal war with France
