

- 7. The purchase of French land between the Mississippi River and the Rocky Mountains that doubled the size of the United States (1803)
- **8.** A 2,000-mile trail stretching through the Great Plains from western Missouri to the Oregon Territory
- **9.** 11th president of the United States and supported of Jacksonian Democracy
- **10.** Men hired by eastern companies to trap animals for fur in the Rocky Mountains and other western regions of the United States
- **13.** members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints
- **15.** A revolt against Mexico by American settlers in California who declared the territory an independent republic (1846
