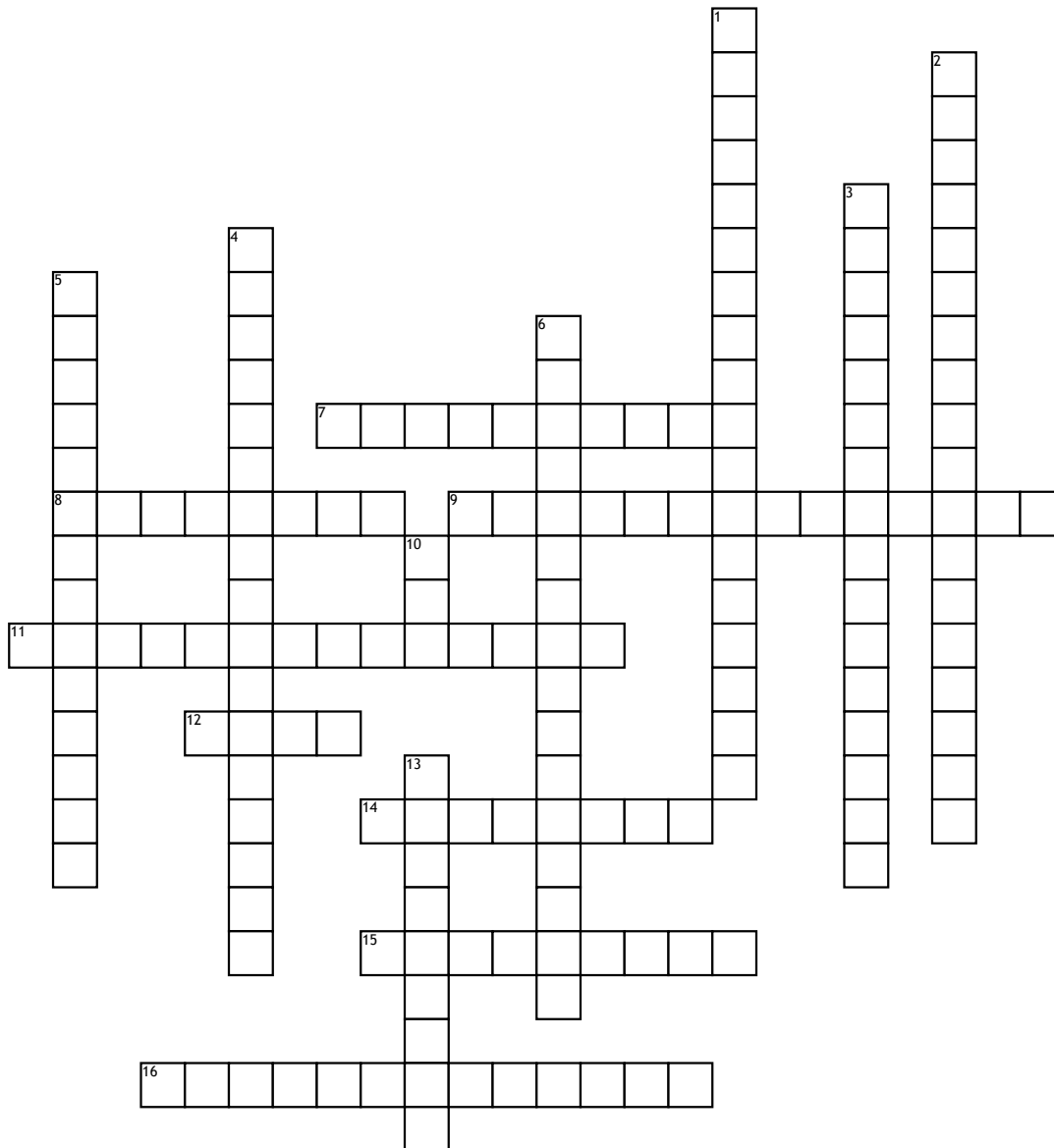

1. a place where large numbers of people, especially political prisoners or members of persecuted minorities, are deliberately imprisoned in a relatively small area with inadequate facilities, sometimes to provide forced labor or to await mass execution
 2. a United States presidential executive order signed and issued during World War II by United States President Franklin D. Roosevelt on February 19, 1942.

3. one of a series of agreements concerning the treatment of prisoners of war and of the sick, wounded, and dead
 4. people in the 20th century who used obscure languages as a means of secret communication during wartime
 5. group of African-American military pilots who fought in world war II
 6. organized in 1942, to explore the isolation of radioactive isotopes and the production of an atomic bomb
 10. the former U.S federal agency (1942-45) charged with disseminating information about World War II
 13. a fixed allowance of provisions or food, especially for soldiers or sailors or for civilians during a shortage
